 some sails and wore ship
 Lat. 38=25 Long. 173=43

Wednesday Oct. 10th
 This day begins with moderate blow
 from N. and Raining the Barge
 lying to with lower main top sail
 Jaded fore top mast stay sail
 and sun down became clear and
 wind quiet light

Thursday Oct. 11th
 Strong breeze from W.N.W. and rugged with
 fine rain squalls the Barge steered N.E.
 with whole main top sail and fore sail

Friday Oct. 12th
 This day begins with strong breeze from N.W.
 and squally the Barge steering N.E. by E.
 at 10 A.M. took in fore sail at M. came to
 and took in fore top sail the weather very
 squally and wind hauled W.N.W.
 Lat. 37=25 Long. 172=27 W.
