Remarks on Board Bark C. W. Morgan

Thursday Oct. 25th

This day begins with rain storm wind from N.E. and we was Boiling had to coal down middle part the same but in the latter part more moderate at 6 P.M. we stowed again but the weather being foggy wind light

Friday Oct. 26th

This day begins with light breeze from N. and hailing to N.E. and rainy some times foggy and we are still Boiling got to stow and commence stowing down in the latter part rain hard at sun down calm

Saturday Oct. 27th

Light breeze and variable all this day we stowed down oil weather clear and saw number feen backs

Sunday Oct. 28th

Light Breeze from W.S.W. in the first part of the day and pleasant the Bark Cruising in the latter part the wind hauled from S.E. and Bark heading S.W. at Sundown took in sails

Monday Oct. 29th

Strong breeze from S.E. and rugged in the first of this day in the latter part the same but wind hauled E.S.E. the crew employed in Scraping Bone the Barque under easy sail

Tuesday Oct. 30th

Light breeze from S.E. and pleasant all day at Sundown wind hauled from S. and still pleasant the Barque under all sails

Wednesday Oct. 31st

This day begins with fresh breeze from N.W. and heavy swell the Barque steered S.E. and S by W. in the latter part quiet smooth and repaired Spanker at Sundown took in sails and come to by the wind heading W wind N.

Thursday Nov. 1st

Fresh breeze from W. in the first of day at 6 A.M. saw whales we lowered 4 boats struck two and lost one struck took one long side and cut in in in the latter part fine weather whales raised by Luis W.B.

Friday Nov. 2nd

Strong breeze from W. and rugged in the first part of this day we are boiling in the latter part the same but we are still boiling

Saturday Nov. 3rd

Strong breeze from S.W. to S. in the first part of the day in the latter part moderate we are still boiling and rigging a new Boat for the fourth mate

Sunday Nov. 4th

Strong breeze from N.E. and rugged we steered S.E. by S. in the first of the day in the latter part the same at 2.30 P.M. saw whale lower three boats but no chance raised by Edward

Monday Nov. 5th

This day begins with Gale from N. and rainy middle part moderate but in the latter part Blowed hard and rugged we took in all sails and try to save have about 70 Barrels of oil on the deck hopping for good weather to stow down

Saw Whales got one

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
