Remarks on Board Barge C. W. Morgan

Monday Nov. 19th

This day commences with light fog and breeze from N.W. at 5:30 A.M. the fog cleared up and Barge steered S. with main top gallant sail out the weather very fine repaired try works

Tuesday Nov. 20th

Fresh breeze from N.W. and thick weather the Barge steering S. and S. by E. to day Lat. 40-30 Long. 172-02 W.

Wednesday Nov. 21st

Light breeze from N. and part fog in the first of the day the Barge steering S. by E. in the latter part the wind hauled from N. to E. and and S.E. and strong breeze with heavy swell from S.W.

Thursday Nov. 22^d

Strong breeze from S.E. and thick weather in the first part of the day in the latter part moderate and clear the Barge under easy sail

Friday Nov. 23^d

The first part of this day calm and rain rainy middle and latter part light wind and variable the Barge steering S.

Saturday Nov. 24th

Light breeze from E. in the first of the day in the latter part wind hauled to N. and N.W. the Barge steering S. at 6 P.M. we came calm and the weather very pleasant and smooth one sick man Russell fore the mast hand

Sunday Nov. 25th

Light breeze from E. and pleasant in the first of the day middle and latter part fresh breeze and little rain wind from N.E. and hauled to E.N.E. and clear for the day the Barge steered S.W. by S. and then S.W. we saw number fern Backs and Shellers

Monday Nov. 26th

Fresh breeze from E.N.E. in the first of the day at 5:30 we came off and steered S.W. by W. at 8 A.M. saw land 44 at 11 A.M. saw Round Island and Pits at M. saw Big Chatham in the latter part the same at sundown Pits 30 miles off about N.W. wind about E.

Tuesday Nov. 27th

Light breeze from E.S.E. in the first of the day at 4:30 we raised whales we saw three Boats west Boat struck took whale long side at 10 A.M. and commenced to cut got body and took off for the day this we lost one man died with fever his name was Russell whales raised by Martin the Island about 15 miles N.W.

Wednesday Nov. 28th

Light breeze from E. at 4 A.M. we commenced work in our whale got true cutting and started Bailing the Island about 15 miles we Bailed that man

Thursday Nov. 29th

Light breeze from E. and E.S.E. all this we are Bailing the Island in sight about 20 miles Bailing N. from us
