Barque Alaska in sight

Friday Feb. 22^d

Fresh breeze from W.N.W. in the first
part of the day in the latter part
wind hauled to N. and cloudy we
gained Alaska

Saturday Feb. 23^d

Strong breeze from N.N.W. and fog-
gy all this day we steered S.W. and
S.E.W. under easy sails

Sunday Feb. 24th

this day in the morning we made sail and
steered W.S.W. at 3 P.M. saw land the
Round Island but the weather still fo-

and stood for the island took up chene
Ready to anchor saw one vessel in to land

water* Light breeze from S. in the first of the
day at 7 A.M. we came to anchor
at Chatham Island got wood and water
Potatoes found two more ship in har-
bor in the latter part the wind hauled
to E. and then N. we still at anchor
at Chatham

gained
Alaska
fly fig* Strong breeze from N. and rugged in the
first part at 4 A.M. we got under way
and stood over to Pils Passage in
the middle part sent one boat fishing
in the latter part more moderate we
gained Alaska wind N.N.W.

Thursday Feb. 28th

*Island
in sight* Strong breeze from N.N.W. and then wind
Borhen to N.N.E. and died out calm
in the latter part light breeze from W.S.W.
we made sails and head for the island
two vessels in sight

Friday Feb. 29

*Came to
Anchors
at Chatham
Island* Fresh breeze from S. in the first of the
day at 6 A.M. we anchor at Chatham Island
for water and Potatoes in company
with Alaska in the latter part moderate
we anchor in about 18 fathoms water
in the latter part wind hauled about E.
S.E. but still moderate and smooth
