Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan.

Thursday April 10th

Strong breeze from E.S.E. in the first part of the day in the latter part quiet clear the Barque under easy sails
Lat. 30-00 Long. 169-28

Friday April 11th

Strong breeze from E.N.E. and hauling to E.S.E. and very rugged the employed in Braking out water

Saturday April 12th

Strong breeze from E. and rugged all this day and Barque under easy sail heading to N.N.E.

Lat. 29-11 Long. 172-10 E.

Sunday April 13th

Strong easterly wind and rugged all day the Barque under easy sails

Monday April 14th

The first part of this day Strong breeze and squally in the latter part moderate gale from E. and ship heading N.N.E. at 6 P.M. wore ship and took in fore top sail heading S.E.

Tuesday April 15th

Strong wind from E. and squally in the first of the day at 6 A.M. we set fore topsail at 6.30 wore ship and heeled about N. middle and latter part the same the ship has been all day with two lower top sails

Wednesday April 16th

Strong breeze from E.N.E. and squally all this day the ship under small sails in the latter part wind hauled to N.E. and still rains

Thursday April 17th

Moderate gale from E.N.E. the ship lying to with no sails under bore cool the weather is quiet squally Lat. 29-19 South

Friday April 18th

This day begins with heavy rain storm on and blowing strong squally part moderate we made some sail the wind about E.S.E. in the latter part quiet moderate we set fore sail and main sail heading about S.E.

Saturday April 19th

Strong breeze from E.N.E. and quiet cloudy in the first part of the day in the latter part rainy the Barque under whole main top sail and courses jib and spanker Lat. 28-22 Long. 173-00 E.

Sunday April 20th

Strong breeze from E.S.E. and squally weather the wind backing to S.E. the bark heading about E.N.E. under two lower topsails and courses

Monday April 21st

Strong breeze and squally all this day the bark under easy sails heading S.E. the wind about E.S.E. and very squally in the first part but in the latter part quiet moderate we saw one vessel merchant men heading to N.E.

Tuesday April 22nd

Strong breeze from E. and cloudy in the first part of the day middle and latter part more moderate and the wind hauling to E.N.E. the bark under two lower topsails courses jib & spanker Lat. 29-02 South
