Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan of New

Wednesday Oct. 1st

Fresh breeze from N.N.E. to N.E. all this day the Barque heading to S.E. with the dory sail out at sundown wore Raus and head to N.W. under easy sail

Thursday Oct. 2^d

This day begins with strong breeze from N.N.E. and very ragged the wind hauling to E. the under two lower top sail and fore sail in the latter part blowed most gale we took fore sail and fore top sail wore ship and head to north

Friday Oct. 3^d

The first part of the day strong breeze from S.E. and rainy we run to North in the latter part blowed gale we took in sail and lay to

Saturday Oct. 4th

Moderate gale from S. in the first of the day and squally we Cape off and steered N.E. by N. we run under fore sail all day at sundown come to by the wind Lat. 37-38 Long. 173-28

Sunday Oct. 5th

Moderate breeze from S. and light rain squalls all this day we steered E. under easy sails

Monday Oct. 6th

Light breeze from P. hauling to S.W. we steered N.E. all day at sundown lay back and repaired lower main top sail in the latter part very fine weather and smooth

Tuesday Oct. 7th

This day begins with light breeze from N. and rainy middle and latter part become foggy and wind hauled to westward and become very light

Wednesday Oct. 8th

This day begins with fresh from N.W. and then we come under storm and variable in the latter part squally we one ship spoke and gamel unditt 9 P.M.

Thursday Oct. 9th

Strong breeze from S.W. in the first of the day in the latter part fine weather and pleasant Barque Swallow in sight

Friday Oct. 10th

This day begins with fresh breeze from N.W. in the first of the day in the latter part strong breeze and commence to rain and we gamel Swallow

Saturday Oct. 11th

Strong breeze from W.P.W. and foggy in the first part of the day and rainy in the latter part quiet clear but the wind still strong

Sunday Oct. 12th

Fresh breeze from N.W. all day and smoky weather the Barque steered S by W and then E.N.E. Cruising

Monday Oct. 13th

This day begins with fresh breeze from N.N.E. middle part fine weather weather red E.N.E. with all sails out in the latter part the wind hauled to S.W. begin to blow gale from S. we took in sail and lay to heading to W. S.W.
