Light wind and variable with very pleasant weather the Barge cruising on the middle ground

Light breeze from E. in the first of the day middle part fresh breeze but in the latter part squally and wind hauled to S.E.

Monday March 23^d

Strong breeze from S. to S.E. all day and quiet rugged with the squalls the Barge heading to E. under lower top sails and courses
