

Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan of New Bedford

Tuesday March 31st

Light breeze and pleasant all the day the Barque heading to E. in the first of the day in the latter part the wind hauled to E.S.E. and E.N.E.

Wednesday April 1st

Light breeze from S. and pleasant in the first of the day we saw two vessel we lower Boat and went long side of one Brig and got some news the latter part the same and the wind hauling to S.E.

Thursday April 2^d

Light breeze from E. in the first of the day and hauling to S.E. with heavy swell from S. the Barque under all sails heading to S.S.W.

Friday April 3^d

Light breeze from S. and pleasant in the first of the day in the latter part fresh breeze from S.E. and this day we have been locking the deck we saw white water and we took ship for it but did not see them again

Saturday April 4th

Fresh breeze from S.E. and the wind hauling to S.E. the weather has been very cloudy all day and gloomy the Barque under easy sails

Sunday April 5th

Light breeze from E. and pleasant the wind hauling from S. to S.E. and back again the weather is quiet clear the Barque under all sails we saw Salpeter Bottom

Saw two vessels spoke of ship to S.E.

Saw plenty of Sprinkles

Monday April 6th

Strong breeze from S.E. to S.E. all day & squally by times the Barque Cruising under easy sails heading to E.N.E.

Tuesday April 7th

Fresh breeze from S.E. to S.E. all day the Barque under easy sails heading to eastward

Wednesday April 8th

Light breeze from S.E. and pleasant in the first part of the day in the latter part the same and the wind hauled to E. the Barque under all sails

Thursday April 9th

The first part of this day Calm in the latter part light air from S.W. to S.E. at Sun down we come calm again

Friday April 10th

Light breeze from W. in the first part in the latter part the wind hauled to S.E. and some squally but smooth the Barque under easy sails we steered some to eastward

Saturday April 11th

Light breeze from S.E. and pleasant all this day the Barque under all sails heading to E.N.E. Saw numbers seen back

Sunday April 12th

Fresh breeze from E. in the first part of the day At 3.20 A.M. Died Robert W. Crag off 4 1/2 months sickness of Typhoid Bright Disease in the latter part squally and the wind hauled to N.E. and at 4 P.M. he was Buried Lat. about 33 S. Long. about 172 00 E.
