Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan of New

Monday Feb. 22^d

This day commences with strong breeze from W.S. and rugged we got ready and went for water and got raft long side at 1 P.M. in the latter part more moderate we took in 67 barrels

Tuesday Feb. 23^d

This day begins with fresh breeze S.S.W. in the first part of the day in the latter part moderate we got off some water and Beef and some Potatoes

Wednesday Feb. 24th

The first part of this day light air from S. middle and latter part fresh breeze from N.W. we got true water and commence wooding

Thursday Feb. 25th

To anchor at Chatham Island strong breeze from N.W. in the first part of the day in the latter part more moderate still wooding

Friday Feb. 26th

Light breeze from N.W. and foggy in the first part of the day middle and latter part fine weather and pleasant got wood and Potatoes and left for Pits

Saturday Feb. 27th

Fresh breeze from N.W. and partly thick in the first of the day in the latter part clear and wind hauled to S.S.E. the Captain lower Boats and went on shore at Pits Island

Sunday Feb. 28th

Fresh breeze from E. in the first part of the day the Captain came aboard and we left Pits in the latter part thick fog we steered S.E.

Monday March 1st

Strong breeze from N.W. in the first of the day the Barque steered E.S.E. and E by S. with main top gallant sail in the latter part the wind hauled to S.W. and strong mate commence standing watch

Tuesday Mar. 2^d

Strong breeze from S.S.W. in the first of the day the Barque steering E. by S. in the latter part more moderate and wind hauled to W.S.W. we steered E.

Long. 169-38 W.

Wednesday Mar. 3^d

Strong breeze from W. to N.W. in the first of this day the Barque steering E. in the latter part squally and the wind hauled to S.W. and S. still squally

Thursday Mar. 4th

Strong breeze from W. in the first part of the day in the latter part N.W. the Barque steering E. by N. with all sail out Lat. 47-13 Long. 161-57 W.

Friday Mar. 5th

This day commenced with heavy N.W. and very squally the Barque steered E.N.E. at 8.30 A.M. took in top sails middle and latter part moderate and the wind hauled to S.W.

Saturday Mar. 6th

Strong breeze from S. to S.S.W. and squally the Barque steering E.N.E. with all sails out in the first of the day in the latter more moderate steering the same course Lat. 46-26 Long. 159-55 W.

Sunday Mar. 7th

Strong breeze from W. to W.S.W. all day the Barque steered E.N.E. and E. by N. we were way the goods next to the spunkier Lat. 45-48 Long. 150-18 W.
