

Remarks on Bark C. W. Morgan of New Bedford

Wednesday Mar. 31st

Strong westerly winds all this 24 hours the
Barge steering E. with main top gallant S-
ail out but the weather squally
our Lat. 55=00 Long. 71=43 W.

Thursday April 1st

This begins with light breeze from S.W. and then
the wind hauled to S. at 5-16 A.M. we raised
the Island of Diego the Ship steering E. S. at
M. the Barge close by the rocks and the wind
breeze up from W. in the latter part strong
breeze from W. to W. N.W. and squally at 4.30
P.M. saw Cape Horn the Barge steering N.E.
by E. took in some sails Lat. 56=24 Long. 78=43 W.

Friday April 2^d

This day begins with strong wind from W. and rain
by the Barge steering N.E. in the first part
of the day in the latter the wind hauled N.W.
we passed Staten Island at 6 P.M. the N.E.
Point of the Island about 10 miles off the
Bark under all sails Lat. 54=30 Long. 64 10

Saturday April 3^d

Light breeze from N.W. in the first part of
the day the Barge steering N.E. by N. with all sail
out in the latter part strong breeze from W. N.W.
at 11 P.M. Pass a small island

Sunday April 4th

Strong breeze from S.W. by N. the Ship steer-
ing N.E. under all sails in the first part
in the latter part more moderate the wind
N.W. the Ship heading by the wind N. N.W.
Lat. 51=53. Long.

Monday April 5th

Strong breeze from N.W. to N.W. by N. Bark
steering by the wind heading about from
N. to N.E. by N. under top sails and courses
all this 24 hours Lat. 49=55 W.

Tuesday April 6th

This day begins with strong breeze from N. N.W.
the Barge heading about N.E. under easy sails
at 4.30 A.M. took in all sails but lower main top
sail at 8 A.M. the wind hauled to W. S. W. and
blown gale from that quarter we made sail
and altered N. and the wind began to moderate
in the latter part quiet moderate & clear we
steered N. by W. Lat. 45=14 S.

Wednesday April 7th

The first part of this day moderate breeze
from S.W. and heavy swell the Ship steer-
ing N. N.W. with main top gallant sail out
at 2.30 A.M. the wind hauled to N. W. &
then to N. N.W. in the latter part commence
raining took all sails but lower main top
sail and fore top mast stay sail
Lat. 46=50 S.

Thursday April 8th

This day begins with heavy squall from S.W. the
Ship had been lying to under main lower
top sail blowing heavy this time we made
same sail and altered N. N.W. course mid-
dle and latter part the wind hauled to
N.W. and Ship head off to N. N.E. Lat. 45=22

Friday April 9th

The first part of this day strong breeze from N.W.
at 2.30 A.M. shorten sails the Ship heading about N. N.E.
from there to N. at 7 A.M. took in the main sail in
the latter part the same Lat. 43=22

Saturday April 10th

The first part of this day light breeze from
S. W. and pleasant weather the Barge
steering N. N.W. course middle and latter
part the wind hauled to W. S. W. but
still moderate and quiet smooth
Lat. 41=34 S. Long. 51=07 W.
