

Remarks on Barque G. W. Morgan of New Bedford

Sunday April 11th

The first part of the light airs and calm with good deal of rain middle and latter part heavy Gale Squalls Thunder and lightning the ship steering N.W. at 1 P.M. took in light sail at 2.30 P.M. took in sails upon top sails the weather very squally no observation

Monday April 12th

Strong S.W. all these 24 hours the ship steered N. by W. in the first part in the latter part steered N. by E. saw whale we hauled for him but we did not find him out

Tuesday April 13th

The first part of this day strong breeze from S.W. and squally middle and latter part light breeze and pleasant steered N. by E. at 6 P.M. steered N.E. & W.

Lat. 34-23 S.

Wednesday April 14th

The first part of this day light airs and calm the Barque steering N.E. & E. but in the latter part breeze from N.W. two vessels in sight Lat. 33-33 Long. 49-29 W.

Thursday April 15th

The first part of this day light breeze from N.E. the steering by the wind heading E.S. & E. middle and latter part the hauled to N. and strong at 5.30 took in to lower top sail at 4 took in main sail Barque heading E.

Friday April 16th

Strong winds from N. in the first of the day the Barque under two lower top sail middle and latter part squally and rainy the wind hauled to westward saw one vessel and wash ship in side steered N.E. wind W.

Saturday April 17th

The first part of this day fresh breeze from S.W. the ship steering N.E. by N. with all sails out in the middle part the wind hauled to South and we took down fore top sail to repair in the latter part light breeze from S.E. and pleasant

Sunday April 18th

All these 24 hours light airs and calm the ship under all sails heading from N. to E. saw one saw Black fish Lat. 31-23 S.

Monday April 19th

Light and variable winds and calm all this 24 hours but made very little head away repaired and changed top sails wait hatter

Tuesday April 20th

Light breeze from N. in the first of the day the Barque steering by the wind heading about E.N.E. with all sails out in the latter part the wind hauled to N.W. we steered N.E. by N. course the weather pleasant Lat. 30-22 L. 40-24

Wednesday April 21st

The first part of this day light breeze from N.W. the Barque heading about N.E. with all sails out in the latter part the wind hauled W.N.W. we steered course N.W. by N. at 4 P.M. saw whales we lower three boats but no chance Lat. 29-10

Thursday April 22^d

The first part of this light and variable wind with rain squall middle and latter strong breeze from E.S.E. to E. and still raining the Barque steering N.E. by N. and N.E. at 5 P.M. we took in the light sails

Friday April 23^d

Light breeze from E. in the first of the day in latter part wind to N. saw steamer Lat. 25-57
