

Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan New Bedford

Saturday April 24th

Light breeze from N.E. the Barque heading to the Eastward with all sails out in the latter part the wind hauled to the N.W. the weather is very pleasant Lat. 25-30 Long. 36-12

Sunday April 25th

The first part of this day light breeze from N. middle part strong breeze and squally the ship steering by the wind took in light sails Lat. 24-25

Monday April 26th

The first part of this day light wind and variable with thunder and lightning the Barque steering N.E. with all sails out in the latter part fine breeze from S.W. Lat. 23-27

Tuesday April 27th

The first part of this day light winds and rain squally the Barque steering N.E. in the latter part strong breeze from N. to N.E.

Wednesday April 28th

Strong breeze from N. all this 24 hours the steering by the wind heading from E. to N.E. by E. took in the light sails Lat. 21-30 Long. 31-40

Thursday April 29th

Light breeze from N. in the first part of the day in the latter part most calm the Barque heading by the wind Lat. 21-02

Friday April 30th

This day begins with light winds and calm on the Barque trying to steer N.E. middle part the wind E.N.E. and light in the latter part fine breeze and clear by times at 5 P.M. rain squalls from ships in sight heading the same we are we steer N. Lat. 20-30 Long. 30-42 W

Saturday May 1st

Light breeze from E.N.E. in the first part of the day the Barque steering N. in the latter part the wind hauled to N.E. the Barque head off to N.W. and most calm Lat. 18-58 Long. 31-31 W.

Sunday May 2^d

The first part of this day calm and light airs middle part the same but in the latter little breeze from W. and light rain squally wind hauling to S. Lat. 18-42

Monday May 3^d

The first part of this day fresh breeze from S. the Barque steered N. with all sails out in the latter part the same Lat. 17-00 South

Tuesday May 4th

Light breeze from S.E. in the first part of the day in the latter part the wind hauled to E. and fine weather this day we commence tarring Lat. 16-23 Long. 32-54

Wednesday May 5th

Light breeze from E. all this 24th the Barque steering N by E. with all sails out and we are still tarring

Thursday May 6th

Light breeze from E. the Barque steering N. by E. with all sails out the employed in tarring saw two steamers Lat. 11-49 Long. 33-17

Friday May 7th

Light breeze from E.S.E. to S.E. in the first part of the day in the latter part the wind about E. by S. the Barque under all sails heading N.E. by N. Lat. 10-09 Long. 33-00
