Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan of New Bedford

Sunday May 23^d

Fresh North east trade and Squally by times the Barque steering N.W. with all sails out all this 24 hours Lat. 7-28 Long. 43-20 W.

Monday May 24th

This day begins with strong breeze from E. and Squally weather in the first part of the day the Barque steering N.W. at 6-30 A.M. Cared away Spanker gaff in the latter part moderate no observation wind N.E.

Tuesday May 25th

Fresh N.E. trade all this 24 hours the Barque steering N.W. with some light sails in Lat. 10-50 Long. 41-49 W.

Wednesday May 26th

Fresh breeze from N.E. and little Squally in the first of the day in the latter part pleasant the Barque steering N.W. course Lat. 12-44 Long. 50-11

Thursday May 27th

Fresh breeze from N.E. and pleasant all this 24 hours the Barque steering N.W. by N. we one vessel steering to westward Lat. 14-37 L. 51-50 W.

Friday May 28th

Light N.E. wind and pleasant the Barque altered N.W. by N. in the latter part altered N.N.W. and the wind very light Lat. 16-32 L. 53-17

Saturday May 29th

Light breeze from N.E. to S.E. all this day and pleasant the Barque steering N.N.W. at 4 P.M. change course to N. Lat. 18-06 Long. 55-23

Sunday May 30th

Light wind variable in the first part with rain Squall in the latter part the same the Barque steering N. Lat. 19-37 Long. 54-45 W.

Bedford C. F. Keith Master on the whaling voyage

Monday May 31st

This day commences with heavy rain Thunder and Lightning in the first of the day in the latter part Pleasant and Smooth Lat. 20-42

Tuesday June 1st

The first part of this day light and variable wind and few rain Squalls middle part calm in the latter part fine breeze from N. the Barque heading to westward

Wednesday June 2^d

All this day light breeze from E. to N.E. the Barque steering N.N.W. we Painted Ship and Put up Spanker gaff Lat. 22-24 Long. 55-58 W.

Thursday June 3^d

Light and pleasant breeze from N.E. in the first part of the day the Barque steering N.N.W. in the latter calm at 5 P.M. saw school sperm whales we lower three Boats but no chance Lat. 23-38

Friday June 4th

Fine breeze from N.E. and cloudy in the first of the day in the latter the same Lat. 24-34

Saturday June 5th

Light breeze from N.E. in the first of the day the Barque heading N.W. by the wind middle and latter the wind hauled to N.E. we steered N.N.W. course Lat. 25-38 Long. 58-34

Sunday June 6th

Fresh breeze from N.E. to E.N.E. and Barque steering N.N.W. with all sail out Lat. 28-05 Long. 60-20

Monday June 7th

Fresh breeze from E.N.E. in the first of the day and little Squally the Barque steering N.N.W. in the latter part the wind hauled to E. and the weather cloudy Lat. 30-19 N Long. 62-02 W.
