Remarks Wednesday March 3rd 1852

P.M. Light winds from the SE and cloudy weather with rain squalls occasionally.

Employed cleaning the main work

A strong current setting to the SW

A.M. V. winds and weather

At 4 the wind shifted to the SW backed ship

Course S.E. Latitude 3° 50'

Remarks Thursday March 4th

Commenced with moderate breeze and cloudy weather with squalls occasionally accompanied with heavy rain took in the fore royal

Employed putting on chafing gear &c

A.M. Squally weather with rain

wind at ESE course South

Pumps regularly attended

Latitude by Observation 2° 40' N

Longitude by Chronometer 102° 39' W

towards Lima

Remarks Friday March 5th 1852

Commenced with fresh breezes and cloudy weather

Employed as yesterday

At 6 backed to the Eastward

wind SE course ESE

A.M. The weather continues squally with rain wind from SE to ESE

no observation this day, the weather being cloudy the sun is not visible

Remarks Saturday March 6th 1852

P.M. Light winds and cloudy with continual rain

A.M. Moderate breezes and clear fair weather

shook all the studding sails out to dry

Latitude by Observation 4° 4' N

Longitude by Chronometer 101° 41' W
