Remarks Sunday March 7th 1852

P.M. Light airs and cloudy weather
sent the fore top gallant sail down
and bent another one sent the main
one down repaired it and sent it
aloft again

A.M. Light breeze and cloudy
At 8 tacked to the Eastward in a light
wind S.E. Latitude by Observation $3^{\circ} 54'$
Longitude by Chronometer $102^{\circ} 3'$

Remarks Monday March 8th 1852

Light winds and clear weather
all sail set on a wind.

A.M. D' winds and weather

Crew employed about the rigging

Concludes with light airs and clear
weather the vessel not under storage
way.

Latitude by Observation $4^{\circ} 8'$
Longitude by Chronometer $101^{\circ} 37'$

towards Saita

Remarks Saturday March 13th

P.M. Moderate breezes and clear
at 1 squared the yards and set the
lower studding sail

Employed cleaning and painting
the iron work

A.M. Moderate and clear

Employed cleaning the rust of the
bolsters &c. Course S.E. by E

Latitude by Observation $0^{\circ} 6' 9''$

Longitude by Chronometer $95^{\circ} 40'$

Remarks Sunday March 14th 1852

Commences with moderate breezes
and clear pleasant weather

Employed as yesterday cleaning the iron
work

A.M. Light winds and clear weather
washed of the decks

Squared the yards

Course E.S.E. wind N.W.

Latitude by Observation $1^{\circ} 16'$

Longitude by Chronometer $94^{\circ} 12'$
