Remarks Saturday March 27th 1852

P.M. Fresh breezes and cloudy weather
Employed repairing the flying jib and
various jobs about the rigging
wind S.E. course S.S.W.

A.M. Moderate breezes and squally
weather

Employed repairing sails &c
Latitude by Observation $4^{\circ} 19' S$
Longitude by Chronometer $88^{\circ} 19' W$

Remarks Sunday March 28th 1852

P.M. Fresh breezes and cloudy weather
Employed variously repairing sails
drawing and securing rope dunnage &c

A.M. Steady fresh breezes and cloudy
all sail set by the wind

At daylight washed decks

wind East making S.E. course

A current setting to the Westward

At noon packed to the S.E.

Latitude by Observation $6^{\circ} 2'$

Longitude by Chronometer $88^{\circ} 59' W$

Brig Charlotte in Timbers

Saturday evening came to
an anchor in Timbers in five
fathoms water and veered out
thirty five fathoms chain

Sunday May 9th 1852
in the morning washed decks and
spread the awning

Monday May 10th 1852

Employed getting the water casks
up out of the hold and cooping them

Tuesday May 11th 1852

Took a raft of six casks on
shore for fresh water filled them
and left them until the change of
tide at night brought the water up

Wednesday May 12th

In the morning hoisted in the water
stowed it below in the afternoon took
the raft on shore again filled the
casks and made them fast

Thursday May 13th

Brought the water on board hoisted
it in and stowed it below
