A.M. At 4 set the lower stud sail

Steady trades and clear weather Course W.S.W. wind E.S.E

Employed rattling the lower rigging making, seizing, stuff &c

Latitude by Observation $3^{\circ} 15'$

Longitude by Chronometer $103^{\circ} 48' 4''$

Remarks Wednesday May 26th 1852

P.M. Fresh breezes and clear weather employed rattling the lower and top mast rigging, Longitude by Lunar

A.M. B. winds and weather $103^{\circ} 24'$

At 6 squared the yards and set the starboard main top gallant sheet-sail Course West wind E by S

Latitude by Observation $2^{\circ} 5'$

Longitude by Chronometer

towards San Francisco

Remarks Thursday May 27th 1852

P.M. Moderate trades and clear employed the same as yesterday

A.M. Light winds and clear Employed rattling and tarring the larboard lower and top mast rigging At 12 shifted the course to N.W. turned the yards and shifted all the studding sails over.

Latitude by Observation $2^{\circ} 30'$

Longitude by Chronometer $108^{\circ} 8'$

Remarks Friday May 28th

P.M. Light trades and clear employed ~~at the~~ setting up the main top mast top gill and royal stays.

A.M. Steady light winds and clear warm weather

Employed setting up the fore top mast back stays

Latitude by Observation $1^{\circ} 00' 9''$

Longitude by Chronometer $110^{\circ} 9' 4''$
