Employed setting up the main top mast backstays overhauling the masts &c

All steady light winds from the ESE and clear

Employed setting up the main top mast rigging

Remarks Sunday May 30th 1852

Tide Light breeze and clear weather

Employed setting up the fore top mast rigging

All Wind and weather as usual  
Course NW by N wind SE  
all possible sail set to the best advantage

Latitude by Observation 1. 52 1/2

Remarks Monday May 31st 1852

Tide Commences with light winds from the SE and clear weather

All wind and weather the same as before steering NW by N

Employed variously about the rigging and picking over onions

Latitude by Observation 3. 15 N

Longitude by Chronometer

Remarks Tuesday June 1st 1852

Tide Commences with fresh breeze from the ESE At 5 the wind shifted to the SE and shifted over the studding sails

All Variable winds with squally weather accompanied with rain took in all studding sails

At 7 a steady breeze from the Eastward set all the back studding sails and started main top gallant & other sail

Concluded with fresh breeze and dandy weather no observation
