Remarks Wednesday June 2nd 1852

P.M. Moderate breezes and cloudy
employed variously about the
rigging &c. At 3 variable winds took in
A.M. all the studding sails

At 1 a light breeze from the
S.E. set studding sails on both
sides concludes with light breezes
and squally with rain Course N.W. by N
Latitude by Obs 5° 55' N Long by Chron 113° 19' 30" W

Remarks Thursday June 3rd
P.M. Moderate breezes and squally
weather with rain

Course N.W. Wind S.E.

A.M. Fresh breezes and squally
weather all studding sails set on
both sides

Employed variously about the
rigging &c.

Concludes with cloudy weather
no observation

Towards San Francisco

Remarks Friday June 4th 1852

P.M. Commences with moderate
breezes from the S.E. and cloudy.
At 2 the wind shifted to the westward
took in all the studding sails and
braced the yards up on the larboard tack

A.M. Light winds from the Westward
and cloudy weather

At 6 set the larboard main top
G.M. and fore top mast. stud sails

Latitude by Observation 9° 35' N

Longitude by Chronometer 113° 27' W

Remarks Saturday June 5th 1852

P.M. Steady light winds from the
Westward and cloudy weather

Employed repairing the topail &c.
A.M. Wind and weather the same
as before

Employed overhauling the masts
repairing sails &c.

Latitude by Observation 11° 42' N

Longitude by Chronometer 113° 7' W
