Remarks Tuesday June 6th 1852

P.M. Light winds and variable with cloudy weather

Employed about the sails and rigging

A.M. Squally appearances with lightning in the S.West

Concludes with light airs from the N.W. and cloudy weather

Latitude by Observation $12^{\circ} 31' N$

Remarks Monday June 7th

P.M. Variable winds and squally weather with heavy rain thunder and lightning took in the royals flying jib and fore top gallant sail

A.M. Variable winds and unsettled

At daylight set the flying jib fore top gallant sail and main royal

Employed picking over spars &c

Latitude by Observation $13^{\circ} 02' N$

Longitude by Chronometer $112^{\circ} 23' W$

Towards San Francisco

Remarks Wednesday June 16th 1852

P.M. Wind and weather continue the same

Employed picking over the masts and various other jobs

A.M. Light winds and cloudy the ship still in sight on the larboard bow

Latitude by Observation $18^{\circ} 45' N$

Longitude by Chronometer

Remarks Thursday June 17th 1852

P.M. Light airs and hazy weather

Employed variously about the sails and rigging

A.M. S.W. winds and weather

The ship continues in sight on the larboard bow

Latitude by Observation $18^{\circ} 56' N$

Longitude by Chronometer $128^{\circ} 24' W$
