Remarks Friday June 18th 1852

P.M. Light winds and cloudy weather the ship still in company on the larboard bow.

A.M. Light winds from the Northward and cloudy

Crew variously employed

Latitude by Observation $19^{\circ} 32' N$

Longitude by Chronometer $128^{\circ} 24' W$

Remarks Saturday June 19th

P.M. A moderate breeze from the N.E. with squalls occasionally

A.M. Dark cloudy weather with squalls at times took in the light sails accordingly

Concludes with light variable winds and unsettled weather.

Latitude by Observation $20^{\circ} 10' N$

Longitude by Chronometer $129^{\circ} 34' W$

Remarks Sunday June 20th 1852

P.M. Commences with a light breeze from the N.E. and cloudy

Employed beating up the onion boxes repairing lifts and footropes &c.

A.M. Wind variable from North to N.E. with squally weather

At daylight washed of the decks

concludes with light breezes from the N.W.

Latitude by Observation $21^{\circ} 19' N$

Remarks Monday June 21st

P.M. Commences with moderate breeze from the N.E. and cloudy weather all sail set by the wind making N.W. course

A.M. the breeze continues from the N.E. with squally weather

Employed picking over onion &c.

Latitude by Observation $22^{\circ} 51' N$
