

Brig Charlotte from Tombu

Remarks Wednesday June 30th 1852

P.M. Fresh breeze and cloudy with squalls accompanied with rain

Employed variously

A.M. Heavy squalls with showers of rain took in the top gallant sails & single reef the fore topsail

Longit Latitude by Observation $35^{\circ} 7'$

Remarks Thursday July 1st 1852

P.M. Strong winds with hard squalls at times took another reef in the fore top sail and single reef the main one

A.M. At 3 more moderate shook a reef out of the fore topsail and set the top gallant sails

At daylight set all sail by the wind Employed repairing the flying jib

Latitude by Observation $35^{\circ} 58' N$

Longitude by Chronometer $145^{\circ} 13' W$

towards San Francisco

Remarks Friday July 2nd 1852

P.M. Moderate winds and cloudy weather

Employed repairing the flying jib A.M. Light air and cloudy unsettled weather

Latitude by Observation $37^{\circ} 16' N$
Longitude by Chronometer

Remarks Saturday July 3rd 1852

P.M. Light winds and variable At 4 unhooked the fore top sail and bent another one & bent the flying jib

A.M. Light variable winds and cloudy unsettled weather. braced the yards accordingly.

Calm

Latitude by Observation $37^{\circ} 7'$
Longitude by Chronometer $145^{\circ} 41' W$
