Remarks Friday July 16th 1852

P.M. Strong breeze from the Westward and cloudy At 4 unhook the mainsail and bent another one. Georg

A.M. Steady strong breeze from West with cloudy weather

A Brigantine in sight on the wind standing to the NW

Employed scrubbing paint work &c

Latitude by Observation 38.31' N

Longitude by Chronometer 130.20' W

Remarks Saturday July 17th 1852

P.M. Moderate breeze and cloudy

Employed cleaning ship.

A.M. At 12 the wind shifted to the SW braced the yards and shifted the shudding sails over to the starboard side.

Employed variously about the rigging several vessels in sight.

Concludes with fresh breeze from Southward and clear weather

Latitude by Observation 38.40'

Longitude by Chronometer 127.13'

& towards San Francisco

Remarks July 18th 1852

P.M. Commences with a strong breeze from the South and clear took in the main top mast & top gallant studding sails. Sea 1/2

A.M. A fresh breeze from the SE and foggy weather

At 2 the wind died away foggy with rain at 8 a light breeze from the NW trimmed the yards accordingly

Latitude by Observation 38.20' N

Longitude by Chronometer 126.14' W
