

Brig Charlotte From Trumb to San Francisco In December 1852

Thursday Dec 9th 1852

Moderate gales from the S.E. & E and ^{clear} weather
Steering by the wind under double
reefed topsails and courses heading N.W.
Employed in Ship's duty nothing in sight
Remarkable to End in Latitude 26° 51' N
Long 127° 56'

Wednesday Friday 10th

First Part of this day Moderate gales from
the N.E. & E. and rugged steering by the
wind under double reefed topsails and
courses heading from S.W. to N.W. by N.
Middle and Latter Part much the same
& A.M. unbutton the main top gallant
sail Employed in Repairing it to End
with Cloudy weather Lat 27° 52' N
Long 129° 49' W

Saturday Dec 11th

First Part of this day Strong winds from
the N.E. & E. and Cloudy weather
Steering by the wind heading S.W.
under short sail Middle and Latter
Part much the same nothing in
sight Remarkable to End this day
Latitude by Obs 29° 04'
Long 131° 30' W

Sunday Dec 12th

First Part of this day Strong winds from
the N.E. & E. and squally weather heading
S.W. under Easy sail & P.M. unbutton
the try sail to Repair Middle
and Latter Part more moderate
hands at leisure to End Lat by det 30° 10'
Long by det 132° 53'

Monday Dec 13th

First Part of this day Strong winds
from the N.E. & E. and hazy weather
heading S.W. Middle and Latter Part
light air and squally weather heading
from S. to N.W. Employed in
Repairing the Old main topsail and
other jobs nothing in sight Lat 31° 00'
Long 134° 02'

Tuesday Dec 14th

Commences with light winds from
the Northward and hazy weather
heading from S. to N.W. with the main
top gallant sail set Employed in
Repairing the main topsail & A.M. the
wind hauled to the S.W. & A.M. set the
standing sail sent up the main royal yard and
set the sail Lat 31° 31' Long 135° 40' W
