Monday Dec 20th Games
First Part of this day strong winds from
the W. N. W. and clear weather steering
N. E. by N with a prudent quantity of sail
set sun set shortened sail and tuffed
up N. N. W. day light kept off N. E. by E
and made all sail and with light airs
from the South Employed in Ship's duty
Nothing in sight Lat 37° 14' N
Long 123° 5'

Tuesday Dec 21st
First Part light winds from the South
and clear weather steering N. E. by N
with all sail set 2 P. M. saw the
Land bearing from N to N. E. three
sails in sight sun set shortened sail
and tuffed too with the head yards abaft
heading W Land Dist 30 miles middle
Part calm Latter Part strong winds from
the S. E. and squally weather with rain
the Land still in sight vessel doubled
reefed the top sails so ends this day
heading E. N. E. Employed in various
jobs No Observations Lat by alt 37° 14' N
Long by alt 123° 5'

To San Francisco In December 1852

Wednesday Dec 22nd
Commenced with strong winds from the
S. E. and squally heading to the E. N. E.
middle Part calm Latter Part
moderate Gale from the E. N. W. heading
W. S. W. 7 A. M. wore ship to the E. N. E.
and made some sail the Land in
sight to the N. E. Dist 35 miles two
sails in sight steering in for the Land
Employed in Ship's duty so ends
this day in sight of the Farallone Isl.
Fin with a light breeze steering E by N
Farallone Islands bearing E by Campa
Dist 10 miles Lat by Obs 37° 51' N

Thursday Dec 23rd
First Part of this day light winds from
the E. N. W. and frequent squalls of wind
and rain steering E by N and the main
top gallant sail set sun set got up the
cables and bent them A. M. tuffed to
the wind heading E. Middle and Latter
Part strong wind from the S. E. and
Latter Part Gale, squall, calm, Rain lightning
and hail from all points of the compass so ends
