21 Cont^d with cloudy weather and
light breezes from S steering S 89 E at 4 P.M. made
day's run being 84 miles west 20 miles south of day
and fire at 8 made Graciosa bearing S 80 E and in
the fore 89 S 80 E of the island. In course and were to
South along and rainy

Middle part a strong gale
from E 80 E with heavy rains two people the ship
Hercul with 4 people and in course

Last part a strong gale from
E 80 E steering to S 80 E saw a sail 3 miles back
Latitude of obs 3 30 2 North

Friday August 28 1846

22 Cont^d with a moderate gale
from E heading by the wind to S 80 E at 2 P.M. were
to see saw the land and a Barge

Middle part a small
gale with cloudy squally weather 2 P.M. were to S 80 E

Last part a gentle gale from
E heading to S 80 E by the wind saw Graciosa
and a Barge 8 miles back

Saturday August 29 1846

23 Cont^d with cloudy weather and
a moderate gale from E heading to S 80 E spoke the
Barge Cecilia Vander 100 tons 2 months out
we came for his letters to the ship at 5 P.M.
set 80 E and in course

24 Middle part fine weather
and light variable breezes making to the Eastward
made all sail

Last part pleasant weather and
light breezes from S steering by the wind to E 80 E
Saw and at George and Graciosa three
men sick watch various employed

Latitude of obs 3 30 2 North

through the Sails of the Group S L Cleared Puerto
Sunday August 30 1846

24 Cont^d with fine weather and
light breezes from S steering by the wind to E 80 E
three islands in sight saw Graciosa

Middle part fine weather
and small breezes

Last part pleasant weather
and light air from S steering by the wind to E 80 E
saw the three Islands two men sick

Latitude of obs 3 30 2 North
Monday August 31 1846

25 Cont^d with fine weather and
light breezes from S heading E saw the three Islands
Middle part fine weather and
light breezes from E steering by the wind to S 80 E

Last part fine weather
and gentle breezes from E steering by the wind
to S 80 E total at 6 A.M. to 12 P.M. 12 to S water
employed in ships duty two men sick

Latitude of obs 3 30 2 North
Longitude from Chron 25 55 W
Tuesday September 1 1846

26 Cont^d with fine but cloudy
weather and light breezes from E 80 E to S steering
by the wind to S 80 E saw three sail

Middle part light variable
and squally weather with heavy rain and severe at
night and three sail

Last part cloudy with light
breezes and squalls at intervals settled the day
chose watch room of employed John Paul Smith
put up with the general Deeds Michael
Mullen Billy and George Sam Day and
all off duty

Latitude of obs 3 30 2 North
Longitude from Chron 25 55 W
