

72 *Barque Cherokee at Maui at anchor*
Tuesday 20 1847

259 All this day fine weather and brisk and variable trades took up the Starboard anchor and lighted the other the Starboard watch on liberty got the windluffs gear mended and the dippail sheets stowed did not come off with the watch

Wednesday April 21 1847

260 Cont^d with fine weather and light variable breezes from N.E. the Starboard watch on liberty took the Starboard anchor and warped up to the passage and let go the Starboard anchor got a raft of water painted the Starboard side of the bends and spare boat unbut the iron course and the top galls sails to attend can

Thursday April 22

261 All this day fine weather and light breezes the Starboard watch on liberty stowed water and sent a raft on shore painted the iron yard and the wish on the iron top gall yard

Friday April 23 1847

262 All this day fine weather and light breezes got a raft of water and shalut the ship to port head of the iron hole cleared the iron hole & the Starboard watch on liberty shipped a man of the name of David Olsen

Saturday April 24 1847

263 All this day fine weather and light breezes from S.E. and all round the Starboard watch on liberty painted the bends on the Starboard side stowed water on the Starboard side forward made a potatoe oven

Sunday April 25 1847

264 All this day fine weather and light breezes the Starboard watch on liberty

Monday April 26 1847

265 All this day fine weather and variable breezes took on board 55 lbs Irish potatoes and 10 lbs sweet potatoes some pumpkins some young watermelons &c got a raft of water stowed a part of it burnt down and main course all hands on board

Tuesday April 27 1847

266 All this day fine weather and light breezes smoked ship and stowed water and cleared away for sea

Wednesday April 28 1847

267 All these 12 hours fine weather and small breezes opened the ship and found some dead rats and cleared for sea got some Irish Potatoes

Thursday April 29 1847

268 Cont^d with fine weather and light breezes the Capt came off at 3 P.M. and brought a man for ship repair by the name of Henry Jones got under weigh and stood down between Maui and Morito in co with the Pilotas and Palmentas stowed the Starboard lower and chain

Middle part fine weather and small breezes running down between the Islands

Last part fine weather and light trades saw pumpbacks and cake at daylight stood down to the port the Capt and I went on shore at noon

Friday April 30 1847

Cont^d with fine weather and small breezes came on board and stowed to sea

Middle part fine weather and light breezes trying to run round the land

269 Last part fine weather and light breezes from port and more calms saw 4 sail the Capt went on board the Scovidas of New Bedford 16 months out 400 open barrel to shipper put master sat up the main stay ketches and head gear generally

Saturday May 1 1847

Cont^d with fine weather and light breezes went on trying to swing the main & sails in sight

270 Middle part fine weather and light breezes from ob-sting N.W.
