Last part cloudy with thick fog and  
small breezes from the north cleared this head and  
blasted the masts at 11 a.m. fog lighted saw a sail made  
sail to E and from 10 Adams Cook & Anthony off duty still

Latitude by obs 54.45 North

Longitude per Chron 158.9 west

Tuesday June 6 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with cludy weather and brisk  
breezes from S E headed to E by the wind saw lots of sulphur bottom  
kelp & millets from the ship's Mercury of Stoughton  
Remelliter 800-60 from 3 whales this morning supplied  
boiling and cruising took in sail at sundown

Middle part cloudy and foggy  
with fresh breezes from E S E heading to N E put out the  
fires at 7 P.M. cut the blubber

Last part thick fog and small rain  
with a fresh gale from E heading to N N E handled the  
lines and spawken at 6 P.M. finished cutting the blubber  
Cook Anthony and Adams of Duty still saw a spot  
Sun also

Monday June 7 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with thick fog and a strong  
gale from E to E N E at 4 P.M. went to S E saw  
spots.

Middle part foggy with a strong gale  
from N E

Last part thick fog and a strong gale  
from N N E at 10 P.M. saw course heading to E  
saw some spots Cook Adams and Anthony off Duty still

Wednesday June 8 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with thick fog and a small gale  
from N N E heading to N W at 2 P.M. set two reef  
top sails and dible at 4 saw two night whales bore  
two boats to us purposes at 7 took in sail thick with  
a fresh gale headed to E

Middle part a fresh gale from N heading  
to E N E with thick fog and rain

Last part thick fog and rain with  
a fresh gale blowing to E N E wind for look Adams and  
Anthony of Duty still

Wednesday June 9 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with thick fog and rain and a  
fresh gale from N N W heading to N E

Middle part thick fog and light  
breezes from N N W heading to N E  
Last part thick fog and light breezes  
at 4 fog lighted from began to boil and made  
some sail Cook Anthony and Adams off duty still

Latitude by obs 54.58 North

Longitude per Chron 152.44 W.

Thursday June 10 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with thick fog and light  
breezes from N N W heading to N E boiling saw a  
spot took in sail at 7 P.M.

Middle part thick fog and light  
breezes from N N W heading to N E boiling  
Last part thick fog with small breezes  
from N N W set the topsails to N N E at 5 a.m. at 7 saw  
a dead whale took him to the ship at 9 a.m. and  
began to cut Cook Adams and Anthony off Duty still

Friday June 11 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with thick fog and small  
breezes from N N W finished cutting and took in sail  
at 7 P.M.

Middle part thick fog and calm  
began to boil re

Last part thick fog and light happing air  
employed boiling cleared the head saw gunpowder and  
a camp Cook Adams and Anthony off Duty still

Longitude per Chron 157.57 west

Saturday June 12 1847

Cont<sup>d</sup> with fog and light air from  
N N W heading to N E boiled and sieged some
