

98. Barque Cherokee Cruising off Queen Charlotte's Island
Monday July 17 1847

349 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather and
light breezes from S.W. heading to N.W. finished cutting
and cleared away the heads

Middle part cloudy and foggy
with light breezes from N.W. heading to N.W. W.
Commenced boiling at 7 P.M.

Last part cloudy with some fog
all hands boiling and scraping bone saw two bright
whales one to fore off and lowered for the other one
boat to no purpose saw finbacks & a sinkers off duty

Latitude of obs 58° 12' North

Longitude per Chron^o 136° 20' West

Tuesday July 20 1847

350 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather
and light airs from S.W. finished scraping bone
saw a bright whale in the fog did not lower

Middle part cloudy and foggy
with light breezes from N.W. heading to N.W.

Last part cloudy with foggy weather
and light breezes from N.W. heading to S.W. saw a bright
whale in the fog lowered the unit boat to no purpose
saw a sinkers off duty employed in boiling

Latitude of obs 58° 17' North

Longitude per Chron^o 136° 26' West

Wednesday July 21 1847

351 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather
and light breezes from N.W. steering to S.W. all hands
steering down in the fore hole on the starboard side cleared
down at 4 P.M. and up the spindles at 5 P.M.

Middle part foggy with light
breezes from N.W. heading to N.W. W. boiling

Last part cloudy and foggy with
light breezes from N.W. heading to N.W. W. saw one
as required saw two sail one boiling all hands boiling
and steering down saw a sinkers off duty saw whales
a head Latitude of obs 58° 12' North

Thursday July 23 1847

352 Cont^d with cloudy weather and
light breezes from N.W. steering to N.W. W. saw
4 or 5 whales saw two boats and chased them
to no purpose saw another sail and some finbacks
boiled and steamed down took in sail at 6 P.M.

Middle part foggy with light
breezes from N.W. heading to N.W. E. boiling

Last part cloudy and foggy with
light breezes from N.W. saw two bright whales
lowered the Labor boat and went to one Robert
Dykesman missed him saw another lower three boats
to no purpose saw finbacks and some whales
all hands breaking out shovels and boiling saw a sinkers
off duty

Friday July 23 1847

353 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather and
light breezes from N.W. steering variously saw a sail and
some finbacks and one or two bright whales did not lower
to foggy all hands steering down and boiling

Middle part foggy with light breezes
from N.W. heading to N.W. E. boiling

Last part cloudy with fog and light
breezes from N.W. steering saw two sail and a whale and
finbacks all hands steering down boiling setting up shovels
saw a sinkers off duty still

Latitude of obs 58° 50' North

Saturday July 24 1847

354 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather and
light breezes from N.W. saw two sail finback and
some bright whales lowered two boats to no purpose
boiled steamed down put up shovels and started heads
spoke ship Capt. Edwards 2000 1300 this season

Middle part cloudy with light breezes
from N.W. heading to N.W. W. boiling
