Saturday July 31 1847

861 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather and
 light breezes from NW we steering to NW the wind
 saw two sails one of them got a whale saw 4 whales
 found three boats to no purpose two capsized at night

Middle part cloudy and foggy
 with light breezes from NW heading to the wind each way
 Last part cloudy with some fog and
 fresh breezes from NW cruising made sail as required saw three
 sails and some flukes and three right whales to windward
 saw a group of three lowered three ~~right whales~~
~~the~~ boats to no purpose the waist boat put capsized with
 her sail out of John & Sinkins & Whitaker and Hanning off duty

Sunday August 1 1847

862 Cont^d with cloudy weather and fresh
 breezes from NW cruising saw two sails and spoke the
 Bremen Norton & New Bedford 2900 6 whales this morn
 saw one right whale but two boats for them to no
 purpose saw two more lowered three boats to no
 purpose two capsized at night

Middle part cloudy with fresh
 breezes from the westward

Last part fresh breezes from NW we
 and cloudy weather saw the Bremen and one right
 whale lowered three boats to no purpose saw some other
 boats Sinkins Whitaker and Hanning off duty still

Monday August 2 1847

863 Cont^d with cloudy weather and fresh
 breezes from NW we cruising saw two and a number

 with light breezes from the westward steered each way of the wind

 light breezes from westward and a calm saw the 2 and

 Whitaker off duty still

Tuesday August 3 1847

864 Cont^d with cloudy weather and light
 breezes from westward saw a right whale lowered
 two boats to no purpose the Capt went on board the
 Bremen and from night came here carried all sail

 breezes from NW we steered NW

Last part cloudy with fog and fresh
 breezes from NW we cruising saw the 2 & Sinkins Adams
 off duty still

Wednesday August 4 1847

865 Cont^d with cloudy foggy weather and
 fresh breezes from NW we steering to NW & by the wind saw
 4 sails and some flukes two capsized at night

Middle part thick and foggy with
 light breezes from NW we steering by the wind each way

Last part cloudy and foggy with
 light breezes from NW we saw 4 sails steered to NW spoke the
 Valais south of New Bedford 2000 whale 500000 gals with
 him John & Sinkins off duty still

Thursday August 5 1847

866 Cont^d with thick fog and light breeze
 from NW we steered to NW in Co with the Valais saw three
 sails the 2 spoke the Clement she was in Co with the
