

Baque Cherokee bound in to St Francisco

Contd

Last part fine but foggy weather and light breezes from the westward steered E by S made all sail at daylight coopers making was four Humphreys John & Linkins names Christy Charles Hanning and Henry flew off duty entire in Irons

Latitude by obs 38.04 north
Longitude by Chron 128.06 west

Friday September 10 1847

400 Contd with foggy weather and light breezes from the westward steered East E by S saw Humph and finbacks birds ship's goats birds and a pinkish headed top gulls and kept to north at 7 PM

Middle part foggy and cloudy with light breezes from 10 AM we saw the Salome rocks at 9 PM and went to 8 PM made sail stood off once by a back

Last part foggy and cloudy with light breezes from the westward steered forward at daylight and steered to ESE saw the Salome rocks there are several of them large huge and apparently barren and inaccessible with breakers all round them washed the ship round out side John & Linkins names Christy Charles Hanning and Henry flew off duty lot of time out of Irons on a promise of good behavior for the future passed the Port Rock at noon

Saturday September 11 1847

401 Contd with cloudy heavy weather and light breezes from 10 AM we steered in to E from the main at 8 PM 1 put the starboard anchor in the shore tank in top gulls at 6 and went to 5 PM

Middle part cloudy with light breezes from 10 AM we lay off and on

Last part cloudy and light air stood in to the port and came to with the starboard bow and 45 fathoms of chain there was 5 whellies lying here John & Linkins names Christy

Contd Charles Hanning and Henry flew off duty still Sunday September 13 1847

402 Contd with fine but cloudy weather and light breezes from all points scrubbed the ship off the side and fitted some water casks

Middle part cloudy with brisk breezes from the land

Last part cloudy with variable breezes from the land took the anchor and put her in shore close to the watering place the starboard watch on liberty

Monday September 13 1847

403 Contd with fine weather and variable breezes from the land three off the watch came on board the others not appearing James Christy John & Linkins Andrew & John's Daniel John Charles Yates George Sandell Adam Whitaker deserted the ship

Middle part cloudy with variable breezes off the land

Last part fine weather and light breezes from the westward steered east by south and water wind and tide John & Linkins off duty discharged Henry flew off duty

Tuesday September 14 1847

404 Contd with fine weather and light breezes from 10 AM we took our anchor and put to sea beat out against a head wind took a passenger the second mate of the Copia Mr Francis to go to the Islands steered the starboard anchor and took the starboard anchor on the bow the land bore 8 or 10 miles distant at sundown

Middle part cloudy with light breezes from 10 AM we steered to S

Last part fine weather and freshening breezes from 10 AM we steered to S we stowed the starboard anchor and the cables stowed off between decks saw a humpback John & Linkins off duty still Handed top gulls saw the main and the Salome rocks
