519 Saturday January 8 1848

Contd with fine weather and brisk
breezes for M & heading to M & in took the whale
along side and cut him in & cleared the head
spoke ship Soppam Piddell of Montserrat 28 mus
out 800 lbs began to bail at 7 P M & 2 and

breezes for M & steered to M & in by the
wind blowing

Last part cloudy squally rainy and
fresh breezes for M & steered to M & in saw a
school 20 or 25 miles off on the Lee had
the coal down tank with made sail as required
saw Breaches and the Soppam John Brown off duty

520 Sunday January 9 1848

Contd with cloudy squally weather
and fresh breezes for M & steered to M & in

Jacob L Cleveland Master
gained with the Soppam saw a school at
this port the two passed the Soppam
course at night

Middle part fine but cloudy with
fresh breezes for M & steered to E by the wind

Last part fine with a squall or
two sailed saw the Soppam John Brown off duty

Monday January 10 1848

Contd with fine weather and brisk
breezes for M & steered to E by the wind saw the Soppam
finished boiling and carried sail

Middle part cloudy with brisk
breezes for M & steered by the wind each way to the

Last part fine with brisk breezes
for M & steered by the wind each way saw a
school the Soppam Mending Cark & M & in Mending
waist boat John Brown off duty

Latitude 43° 50' 7" South

Longitude 169° 51' E

Tuesday January 11 1848

Contd with fine weather and brisk
breezes for M & steered to M & in at 4 P M saw a
school of sperm whales round the boat the waist
started a heavy squall came on gun up the cheer
came on board thus deep and they came in saw no more
of them

Middle part cloudy with light
breezes for M & steered to M & in and fine sail

Last part cloudy with brisk breezes
for M & steered to M & in saw a school of sperm
whales at 8 A M landed three boats the waist and
waist boat got one each the waist boat fastened and
cleared tank the waist boat whale along side at
11 P M
