

Barque Cherokee at Guam by of Apra at anchor
 554 Saturday February 12 1848

Count with fine weather and brisk
 breezes from N E steered by the wind sailing up to
 the Bay got in to Apra at 6 PM and came to
 in 20 fathoms of water with the starboard Bower
 and 60 fathoms of cable the N W part of Point Leland
 the N E of Compass and the Port N E of E to about
 1 1/2 miles back

Middle put fresh breezes from
 N E and squally
 Sent put fresh breezes from N E
 fitted cask for a raft and a place to fill it on
 shore put the pint down the royal yards
 for each three or 6 hours

555 Sunday February 13 1848

Count with fine weather and brisk
 breezes from N E all but a boat crew on liberty
 the Callaghan disher anchored them to day
 with 1400 barrels of cable and 4500 lbs of shot
 Percussion Smith 1400 lbs of powder
 and Barque Eliza Howell of 2500 while
 6 men did not come off with the watch when
 down and moved off duty

Middle and last put. winds and weather in continuance

556 Monday February 14 1848

Count with fine weather and
 brisk breezes from N E got two rafts on shore filled
 one and a part of the other fitted a third the
 starboard boat crew on liberty Capt Cleveland went
 to town to day the John E. Donnell Murray of
 New Bedford arrived there to day 1775 barrels of
 powder Middle and last arrived and weather in continuance

557 Tuesday February 15 1848

Count with fine weather and
 brisk breezes from N E to E N E with occasional
 gusts put a raft of 16 cask on Bower and
 a part of a barrel of wood on board with the

at Apra at anchor Jacob L Cleveland made
 hole John Brown off duty winds and weather in
 continuance

558 Wednesday February 16 1848

Count with fine weather and brisk
 breezes from N E to E N E got another raft on shore
 and filled two and put them partly off stored the
 one on board John Brown off duty Middle and last
 put winds and weather in continuance

559 Thursday February 17 1848

Count with fine weather and brisk
 breezes from N E to E N E got off two rafts of water and
 stored it let go the starboard anchor sent the starboard
 watch on liberty for 4 days Middle put much the same
 Last put squally with rain at intervals

560 Friday February 18 1848

Count with fine weather and brisk
 breezes with rain at intervals Coopered bread and
 stored off between decks John Brown and Coill off
 duty the watch on liberty Middle and last put
 the same

561 Saturday February 19 1848

Count with fine weather and rain at intervals
 and moderate breezes from N E to E put up shoes
 and put the cable cleaned the sides & C Coill and
 John Brown off duty still Middle put squally
 Last put rainy with brisk squally weather on liberty

562 Sunday February 20 1848

Count with squally rainy weather
 and brisk breezes from N E Coill & John Brown off duty
 Middle put cloudy with moderate breezes Last put
 squally and rainy

563 Monday February 21 1848

Count with heavy rains and squally
 weather and fresh breezes from N E to E Coill and
 John Brown off duty put up shoes the watch all
 came on board except Peter Middle and last put
 rain put cloudy with moderate breezes
