breezes from N & E got a raft of water and
steamed a part of it ashore on shore off duty
the Indians sent got a small plank boat.

476 Saturday 4 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and light
breezes from N & E to E steamed water cleared boats
put ashore and cleared up for sea will come on
board at night Middle and last part of the day
wind and weather in continuance

477 Sunday March 5 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and light
breezes from E to N & E the starboard watch on duty
a part of the day Middle and last part in cut.

478 Monday March 6 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and
light breezes from N & E to E the starboard watch
on duty got 14 tons of opium and one ton of potatoes
Middle and last part wind and weather in continuance

479 Tuesday March 7 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and
light breezes from N & E to E put ashore took the
starboard anchor so ended the calm day

480 Wednesday March 8 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and
breeze breezes from N & E to E took the anchor at 11
A.M. and stood to sea for a sail steamed anchors
and cables stowed by the wind to N.W. till 6
P.M. and then N.W. by N

Middle part fine weather and
light breezes from N & E steamed N.W.

Last part fine weather and light
breezes from N & E steamed N.W. by N watch

to the main took in the starboard boat and put
out another sent the new royal yard to the main
watch variously employed James Corvill off duty

482 Friday March 10 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and light
breezes from S.E. steamed N.W.

Middle part fine weather and
light breezes from N.W. when Course N.W. by N

Last part fine weather and small

variously employed James Corvill off duty

483 Saturday March 11 1848

Cont^d with fine weather and
light breeze from N.W. by N

Middle part cloudy squally with
small rains and brisk breezes from N & E steamed N.W. by N
we split the sky silk rounded 2 P.M. top falls and
put one reef in the fore top sail

Last part cloudy with brisk breezes
from N & E steamed N.W. by N James Corvill off duty
