 P.M. moderate winds steering a course

 N.W. under 1/2 sail. A.M. saw a sail
 weather now employed at setting up
 fore rigging and rearing new deadwood
 wind moderate from S.E.

Lat 17.51 S Long 33.13 W

Remarks On Tuesday Jan 31st
 P.M. finished foremast and went
 to work on the main setting up
 the lower rigging. Wind very moderate
 from S.E. steering S.W. half N.W.
 at 3rd quit work and got supper.
 Moderate wind, through the night
 A.M. 3rd mate up in the main top
 setting main topmast rigging at 6th a
 high squall between the Capt. & 2nd mate about
 the rigging but it was soon over the Port watch on
 deck getting fore topmast rigging and setting off
 the fore rigging Lat 16.14 S Long 36.46 W

Remarks On Wednesday February 1st
 P.M. moderate winds from S.E. steering
 a course S.W. by W. Starboard
 watch on deck employed at seizing off
 main rigging and attending to various
 other duties. At 4, cleared up and washed.
 At midnight light air and calm
 A.M. first broke out for meat at
 6th sent down fore topsail to repair and
 taking down heads stags.

Lat 17.18 S Long 37.12 W

Remarks On Thursday February 2nd
 P.M. light air and calm, extremely warm
 1st sent up fore topsail and sent it
 taking down fore & main topmast backstay
 to work on fore topmast rigging 4th washed
 At moderate through the night.
 A.M. light air from S. & S.E. to S.W.
 steering a course S.W. 3rd setting up
 main topmast rigging 4th Port watch
 on deck sent down fore topsail running parcel
 and wormed it.

Lat 17.30 S Long 37.13 W

Remarks On Friday Feb 3rd
 P.M. having a light breeze from S.W.
 and steering a course S.W. the
 weather extremely hot. Starboard watch on
 deck attending ship's duty at 2nd washed off
 Midnight, 4th breeze A.M. got the
 tackle up over after hold and broke out
 for corn & meat at 6th stowed off, hand
 to work making spurnyarn. 8th
 Starboard watch on deck employed at making
 spurnyarn.

Lat 18.55 S Long 38.41 W

Remarks On Saturday Feb 4th
 P.M. fresh breeze from S.E. steering S.W.
 weather extremely hot. Port watch on
 deck employed at making spurnyarn
 attending to their duties. 1st washed off
 4th washed off. Midnight had a good
 breeze from S.E. A.M. saw the land
 coast of Brazil bearing S.W. by W. Distance
 10 miles. watch employed. 1st Port watch
 on deck attending ship's duty. saw a bird
 off the bow started for it saw nothing more
 Lat 20.23 S Long 39.44 W
