 steering S.S.W. thick and mist weather  
 at 3<sup>rd</sup> h. steering S.W. by S. At night  
 strong wind. A.M. moderate at 11<sup>th</sup>  
 nearly calm. Port watch on deck  
 making spinnaker and setting jib  
 stay. A fore topgallant stay 10<sup>th</sup> h. saw a  
 sail off weather and steering N.  
 11<sup>th</sup> h. having a fine breeze from  
 S.E.

Remarks On Tuesday Feb 5<sup>th</sup>  
 P.M. having a gentle wind from  
 S.E. steering a course S.W. by W. Starboard  
 watch on deck employed at making spinnaker  
 and other duties at 4<sup>th</sup> h. a "Bark"  
 passed under our lee steering N.W.  
 washed off. Mid. ght. having a strong  
 wind from S.E. A.M. quite moderate  
 Port watch on deck employed at making  
 spinnaker and attending to other duties

Remarks On Wednesday Feb 6<sup>th</sup>  
 P.M. having a moderate wind from  
 S.E. steering a course S.W. by W. Starboard  
 watch on deck employed at making  
 spinnaker and at various other things  
 the weather is mild and pleasant  
 4<sup>th</sup> h. cleared up and waisted off. Midnight  
 a gentle breeze. A.M. light breeze from E.  
 Port watch on deck employed at making  
 spinnaker and attending to other duties  
 at 11<sup>th</sup> h. saw a jumper breach off beam  
 at 12 h. saw large piece of squid  
 Lat 26.21 South  
 Long 44.11 Mist

Remarks On Thursday Feb 7<sup>th</sup>  
 P.M. light winds from E. steering S.W. by S.  
 11<sup>th</sup> h. "Mr. Goshus" saw sperm whales 13 points  
 off Starboard bow chased them with the  
 ship till half past 2, and then lowered three  
 boats. "Whale going quick" at 5 o'clock the  
 bow boat struck the other boats chased the school  
 till near sunset and then gave them up come  
 aboard and took the whale alongside and got  
 supper at 6<sup>th</sup> h. commenced to cut in. "every thing  
 good so far" at half past the whale in on deck  
 Starboard watch first on deck clearing away  
 the head &c. Midnight and later port. Port  
 watch on deck employed at the same 12 h.  
 worked around heading E. at 5. A.M.  
 commenced to clear away the head  
 at 7. Starboard watch on deck to work  
 on blubber at 9<sup>th</sup> h. started the fires  
 and commenced boiling at 12 h.  
 veered ship. steered N. till 2.  
 Mr. Goshus claims the raising of them  
 whales yesterday
