

Remarks On Friday Feb 10th 1860
 P.M. Having a moderate wind from
 S.E. steering by the wind till 2nd h. and
 then under full sail. Port watch on deck looking
 after and attending to other duties in
 making. at 4th h. the watch Starboard watch
 on deck. at 12 M. Port watch on deck
 looking after 3rd h. coiled down rolled away
 11 bbls of sperm oil from the cooler. A.M.
 Starboard watch on deck cleaning ship
 82
 Lat 21° 10' N Long 46° 24' W

Remarks On Saturday Feb 11th
 P.M. Having a strong wind from N.E.
 steering S.W. ship under double reefed sails
 2nd h. steering S.W. Moderate. Port watch
 on deck employed at ship's duty. 4th h. washed
 off. in daylight light squalls arrived
 from S.E. blowing the spray over the ship. S.M.
 occasionally a few low clouds
 a "bar" of port beam saw breeches from
 port head which was broken with a splinter
 the oil got at reach to stow down.
 Lat 21° 31' N Long 46° 01' W

Remarks On Sunday Feb 12th
 P.M. light winds & calms 1st h. steered
 down the oil between decks. 2nd h. light breeze
 from S.E. heading S.W. Starboard watch
 on deck employed at washing ship, heaving
 in a strong wind clewed up main top sail
 and fished it. Midnight quite moderate
 nearly calm rest of the time. A.M. a gentle
 breeze from S.E. at 1st h. thick and foggy
 at 10th h. saw a break off weather ahead
 Lat 20° 35' N Long 47° 51' W

Remarks On Monday Feb 13th 1860
 P.M. Having pleasant weather with a
 gentle wind from S.E. heading S.W.
 Port watch on deck not anything worth
 noting. afternoon. Midnight had a
 steady breeze from N.N.E. steering a
 course S.S.W. A.M. this morning
 pleasant and clear. suned at bright
 and early. the first thing I saw was
 large school of "grampus" breaking and
 spouting. I was employed at balling up
 sperm. Lat 22° 13' N Long 48° 27' W

Remarks On Tuesday Feb 14th
 P.M. pleasant and clear and a gentle
 breeze from N.N.E. steering S.S.W.
 Starboard watch on deck employed at ship's
 duty. any quantity of grampus in sight
 Midnight a strong wind from N.N.E.
 A.M. moderate with a heavy swell, and
 misty weather. at 9th h. saw a school of
 Port bow steering S.W. the watch
 employed at ship's duty.
 Lat 24° 30' N Long 49° 32' W

Remarks On Wednesday Feb 15th
 P.M. light winds from N.N.E. S.W. &
 steering S. & S.W. broke out low
 mist. remainder of the time making
 sunset 82 4th washed off. Midnight
 light breeze till 1st h. A.M. had a strong
 wind from S.E. steering full and by
 5th h. a sail off the bow. Steered
 by the wind on the starboard tack
 at 8th h. got a distance from the Sun to the Moon
 "Long by Lunar" 50.13 Lat 26° 03' N Long Chron 50° 33' W
