

Remarks On Wednesday Feb 22nd
 P.M. Drugged and squally. Swept the
 rigging. About 4 P.M. deadened. Ship
 under short sail. 3 P.M. Drugged
 of duty sick. Midnight light rain
 and calm. Some lightning in the
 P.M. at daylight had a good breeze
 P.M. with a strong rain, took in the
 light sails. Starboard watch on
 deck. Brought out for water down
 main hold.
 Lat. 44.30 Long. 49.57 West

Remarks On Thursday Feb 23rd
 P.M. 1 P.M. had a gentle breeze from
 N.W. steering a course of N.W. by E
 4 P.M. thick and cloudy braced up the
 yards, heaving to. At 5 P.M. caught
 ship heaved to. About 6 P.M. through
 the night. At 10 P.M. saw a sail off weather
 quarter the wind moderate
 with some squalls 10 P.M. set the main
 topgallant sail.
 Lat 43.20 Long 50.09 West

Remarks On Friday Feb 24th
 P.M. A strong wind from N.W.
 ship heading S.W. by E by compass point of
 N.W. Starboard watch on deck. 4 P.M.
 took in the topgallant sail & double
 reefed the topsails. 8 P.M. muddied down
 10 P.M. turned out the reef. Midnight the same
 At 1 P.M. Port watch on deck. At the main topgallant
 ship heading S.W. by N. at 12 P.M. saw a
 sail off Port bow steering S.E.
 Lat 43.30 Long 50.44 West

Remarks On Saturday Feb 25th 1860
 P.M. A gentle wind from N.W. steering
 a course of N.W. by E. Brig off the beam steering S.E.
 Port watch on deck. Set up flying jib 2 P.M. 3 P.M.
 washed off a strong wind and a head beat
 set up to the 10 P.M. at 11 P.M. steering
 S.W. by E. 10 P.M. double reefed the fore
 & main topsail. saw some shells on
 the water.
 Lat 40.34 Long 53.21 West

Remarks On Sunday Feb 26th
 P.M. A strong wind from N.W. steering
 a course of N.W. by E. ship going
 along under double reef of the
 the weather is thick and misty
 weather very changeable up to 12 P.M.
 3 P.M. wind from S.W. by E. braced around
 on the port tack 3 P.M. blowing strong
 squalls and a slow rain. double reefed
 the topsails and furlled the mainsail 4 P.M.
 muddied turned in reef out of the topsails
 5 P.M. turned the reef out of the main topsail set main
 topgallant sail.
 Lat 41.38 Long 54.13 West

Remarks On Monday Feb 27th
 P.M. Moderate and pleasant wind
 from N.W. steering S.W. by E. pass some
 help. 3 P.M. turned the reef out of the
 fore topsail and set the fore topgallant
 Midnight nearly calm at night 1 P.M.
 3 P.M. I saw off pointed greeted a whale
 the weather clear and pleasant with
 light airs from N.W. steering S.W. by E.
 Broke out for bread & but at 12 P.M. signals
 the ship off the quarter. At 1 P.M. sent distinctly
 but called it the Elizabeth of N.B. Lat 41.43 Long
 Long by Lunar 52.07 by Chron 52.03
