

Remarks On Monday March 3rd 1860
 P.M. Heaving a gentle wind from E. steering a course N.W. by S. 2 points East. At 2 h. steering N.W. saw rocks called the Diego's off the Starboard beam bearing N.W. by W. Dist 20 mls. At 4 h. off Starboard quarter steering the same as ourselves, moderate breeze through the night. At 5 h. saw a large ship, green, red, white, ship bearing N.W. by S. At 6 h. off the point of Cape Cod at 7 h. at 10 h. at 11 h. at 12 h. backed ship. Lat 37.11 Long 77.21 West

Remarks On Tuesday March 4th
 P.M. gentle winds from N.W. ship head N.W. by W. by Com. A ship off weathered on the same side as ourselves. The weather moderate with a heavy S.E. swell heaving. At 3 h. hail squall at 6 h. touched ship heaving the light up and calms till 2 h. At 4 h. had a light breeze from N. steering a course N.W. by S. At 5 h. a six topsail yard ship off Starboard bow passed up between the stern and the main the "Forest Queen" of Boston two other sails in sight.
 Lat - Long No observation

Remarks On Wednesday March 5th
 P.M. Heaving a fresh wind from E. with considerable wet, steering a course N.W. by S. two courses. A large ship off Starboard beam call her "Man of War" at 4 h. passed ship. Midnight strong wind from S.E. and in the light sails and some squalls in the night. At 3 h. double reefed the fore sail and furl'd the mainsail at 4 h. double reefed the main topsail.
 Lat 37.33 Long 77.43 West

Remarks On Thursday March 6th
 P.M. Heaving a fresh wind from S.E. with a very heavy sea running, turned the reef out of the main topsail and set the main topsail and sail, at 1 h. turned the reef out of the fore topsail and set fore topsail, at 3 h. furl'd a brace to the port took away the waist boat and all stowed and broke off the after davit which was very poor broke in the gunwale of the deck boat. Course N.W. by S. at night under way. At 10 h. made a stand from S.E. to N.W. steering N.W. by S. at 11 h. took down one of the mizzen sails to fit for the Starboard cranes. Lat 37.31 Long 78.31 West

Remarks On Friday March 7th
 P.M. Moderate winds from N.W. steering N.W. by S. employed at fitting a new boat for the Starboard cranes, took the old Starboard and put across the stern, at 1 h. cleared up the deck & braced up the yards, rain night. During strong from N.W. and squalls and terminated in an gale took all sail but closed reef main topsail & foresail at 2 h. At 3 h. backed ship at 5 h. muddered set the fore topsail & mainsail, all of the latter part raining.
 Lat 37.21 Long 78.02 West

Remarks On Saturday March 8th
 P.M. Strong winds from N.W. and a heavy sea, steering N.W. by Com. 2 points East at 2 h. checked in the yards. During light winds and a heavy sea ship rolling heavy. Capt. had an occasion to chastise the steward this morning for being drowsy. At 4 h. a strong wind from S.E. by S. the watch employed at fitting boats & craft.
