Remarks On Sunday March 11th 1860
 P.M. Strong wind from S.W. steering
 N.W. with an heavy sea, the vessel employed
 at fitting craft in order for whaling
 saw a whale off starboard beam, supposed
 to be a right-whale. Midnight light
 signals. A.M. nearly calm all the morn
 had a few light airs from S.W. at 10^h
 saw a spout on point of starboard bow
 a "finback" got an lunar observation.

Remarks On Monday March 12th
 P.M. Light air from S.W. ship heading
 N.W. by the wind at 4^h. Which is
 some looks as if we might have more wind
 soon. Midnight had a gentle breeze
 from S.W. ship heading N. to S.W. to
 A.M. painting a boat and took down
 a new boat from overhead to fit for
 the mast cranes. Ship going along
 under all sail with a gentle breeze and
 smooth.

Remarks On Tuesday March 13th
 P.M. Breeze a gentle wind from
 N.W. ship heading N.W. by the wind
 - the weather thick and cloudy, and very
 smooth. the vessel employed at fitting
 a new boat. moderate wind at
 night. A.M. Starboard watch on deck
 employed at fitting boats, and got
 a gentle wind from S.W. steering
 N.W. by Com. at 9^h saw a sail off
 port - passed.

Remarks On Wednesday March 14th
 P.M. Breeze a moderate wind
 from S.W. steering N.W. by Com. a sail
 off weather passed S.W. Port watch on
 deck employed at ship's duty. at 2^h
 put the new "starboard boat" on the cranes
 and the new "starboard boat" on the cranes
 to paint. Midnight fresh wind from
 S.W. steering N.W. by S. A.M. fair
 weather but cloudy, broke up for "Gloss
 Molasses, & Kier, at 10^h expected flying fit
 lobster and captured B. & C. Lat 48.17 Long 77.30

Remarks On Thursday March 15th
 P.M. Breeze wind from S.W. steering
 N.W. by S. by Com. the vessel employed
 as usual, Cooper making blue fish &c
 for the boat, at 4^h thick weather with
 slow rain. Midnight a moderate wind
 A.M. fair weather with a gentle wind
 7^h Port watch on deck attending to ship's
 duty. saw a sail ahead, so on.

Lat 39.27 South Long 80.11 West

Remarks On Friday March 16th
 P.M. Commences with a moderate
 wind from S.W. steering N.W. by S. at
 1^h rose a new cutting fall, to watch
 attending various other duties at 2^h
 steering N.W. Midnight steady wind
 A.M. 4^h wind from S.W. and S.W. S.
 M. the vessel employed at ship's duty
 at 10^h took in the fore, upcalant, -
 saw a sail 1 point off weather bow
 11^h rainy Lat 36.30 South Long 80.16 West
