Remarks On Sunday March 18th
 P.M. Commenced with a moderate wind from
 S.W. steering by the wind, ship heading N.W. by
 Port watch on deck employed at weighing ship.
 At 4^h saw a sail off the bow - washed off the deck
 and got supper. At 6 o'clock steered for the ship off
 the bow at 6^h huff to the wind, the
 ship to the leeward hauled up the mainsail
 after we left to the wind. At 7^h took in the
 light sails and the mainsail. Midnight reefed
 the fore & main topsails. A.M. 6^h veered ship and
 steered N.E. by E. by Compass.

Remarks On Monday March 19th
 P.M. Thick and cloudy weather, steering
 N.E. by N with a moderate wind from
 S.W. at 3^h steering E. N.E. Midnight
 moderate wind. A.M. At daylight saw
 land 4 points off the bow. The Island Massafuera
 bearing N.N.E. 10 to 20 miles. 2 sails in sight
 off the beam. "Whaler" got the tacked up over
 the main after hatch got out some sugar
 1^h Starboard watch on deck employed at
 ship's duty.

Remarks On Tuesday March 20th
 P.M. Massafuera off the beam 25 miles distant
 having a fresh wind from S.E. steering
 E. N.E. for Juan Hernandez to get a stick for
 a (davit) and a mess of fish. Port watch on
 deck attending to ship's duty. At 1^h sent off the quarters
 heading E. Midnight hauled back the main
 topsail and layed till daylight. A.M. Spent 3 points
 forward the beam, braced forward, and made sail
 steered for it. employed at getting fishing tackle
 ready.

Remarks On Wednesday March 21st
 P.M. Off "East" point of Juan Hernandez steering
 for the town with a strong wind from S.E.
 1^h lowered the waist boat 2nd mate & crew went in
 fishing 4^h Capt. went ashore at the town to get a
 stick for a "davit" ship laying off & on in the mean time
 at 5^h Capt. came aboard with stick & a few perches
 at 6^h waist boat got aboard with fish. 1st the boat
 anchored. 1^h steering N.W. watch on deck cleaning
 fish. Midnight having a fresh wind. A.M.
 carpenter employed at making a davit - cloudy
 weather &c. Lat 31:56 Long

Remarks On Thursday March 22nd
 P.M. Barring the wind from S.E. steering
 N.W. Port watch on deck attending to ship's duty
 carpenter employed on the "davit". The weather
 thick and cloudy at 4^h steering N.E. by E. braced
 the yards, washed off. Midnight moderate
 wind. A.M. Pleasant weather & moderate
 wind - carpenter employed on the davit, the
 watch employed at breaking out, and making
 a "blacksmith Forge".
