

Ship China On The Coast of Peru. 1860

Remarks On Thursday March 29th
P.M. Hailing a fresh wind from S.E. steering
a course N.E. by E. Starboard watch on deck
attending to ship's duty. - cooper busy making
tubs, at 4 h. - cleared up and washed off.
Midnight calm. A.M. light air from
S.E. steering N.E. by E. at daylight - land in sight
at starboard beam "Coast of Chile" 1 h. starboard
watch on deck. - carpenter repairing the old starboard
boat, unshipped the windlass to clean make
some new bolts &c.

Lat 22° 51' South Long 71° 21' West

Remarks On Friday March 30th
P.M. Hailing a gentle wind from S.E. steering
N. by E. spaced ground the yards
land in sight off starboard beam watch
employed at cleaning the windlass. Carpenter
employed on the boat. - got the forge up
making bolts for the windlass. Midnight
hailing a gentle wind. A.M. moderate
weather. 1 h. Port watch on deck. employed at
making a sunset and overhauling the sails
sparring them at 10. steering N.W. by W. - saw Sulphur
Bottoms & Humboldt at 11 h. saw Blackbird about three
boats did not get on any sail. Lat 22° 51' Long 71° 31'

Remarks On Saturday March 31st
P.M. Commences with a gentle wind from
S.E. steering N.W. Starboard watch on deck
attending to ship's duty. 2nd Mate blacksmithing
land in sight. saw a number of Sulphur Bottoms
4 h. washed off. Night. Hailing with the
main topsail aback with a moderate wind
A.M. veered ship and steered N.W. by N.
Starboard watch on deck employed at ship
duty. - caring for all branches carpentering
coopering & blacksmithing.

Lat 20° 29' South

Remarks On Sunday April 1st
P.M. commences with a moderate wind
from S.E. steering N.W. by N. Port watch
on deck attending to ship's duty cleaning
ship and numerous other duties. at 8 h.
up to the wind with the main topsail
aback, heading N.W. by N. Midnight laying with
the main topsail aback. A.M. daylight veered
ship & steered N. with a pleasant breeze
Port watch on deck &c.

Lat 17° 44' South Long 72° 12' West

Remarks On Monday April 2nd
P.M. Moderate winds from S.E. steering
N. at 3 h. steering N.W. by N. - we are having good
weather but nothing to be seen, occasionally
a Pinback, or stray Grampus. Midnight
moderate wind. A.M. wind got 2 h. of mist
Port watch on deck, setting main topmast rigging
& main topmast rigging. the weather thick
and cloudy. saw Grampuses from aloft

Lat 16° 32' South Long 72° 39' West

Remarks On Tuesday April 3rd
P.M. Commences with moderate winds from
S.E. steering N.W. by N. thick & cloudy.
Starboard watch on deck on the main topmast
rigging and blacksmithing and numerous
other duties. - un et off to go wind heading
S.W. A.M. 5 h. sent in fore topmast steeple
and stowed it away. sent in top outer jib
and put the cloth on it make a one jib
ship of her. Port watch on deck employ
