 watch on deck employed at making
 sail & attending to various other
 duties, weather mild & pleasant

Remarks On Wednesday April 11th
 P.M. Moderate trade steering S. N. W.
 Port watch on deck employed at making sail
 & at other duties. Carpenter employed on
 the bow boat, at 4^h cleared up, put the "cabana"
 & washed off. Midnight the same
 A.M. Pleasant weather with a moderate
 wind. Port watch on deck employed
 at fitting the rigging. - saw 1 skinback
 from aloft.
 Lat 11.42 South Long 79.33 West

Remarks On Thursday April 12th
 P.M. Moderate trade steering
 S. N. W. Starboard watch on deck
 employed on the rigging. - saw skinback
 at 4^h cleared up & washed off
 overine. A.M. Starboard watch
 on deck employed on the rigging.
 at 10^h saw a skinback, with the
 windward & saw skinback weather
 pleasant & mild
 Lat 8.33 South Long 80.24 West

Remarks On Friday April 13th 1860
 P.M. Moderate trade steering S. N. W.
 Port watch on deck employed on the rigging
 & making sail. saw Grampus &
 skinback, at 3^h steering S. N. W. saw Blackfish
 going to the windward quick. at 4^h washed
 off. - saw more Blackfish going to the
 windward. Midnight light breeze. A.M. this
 morning at daylight saw land S. S. Island 2 point
 off port bow 3 miles dist. buffed the ship to the wind
 by port tack till out of the reach of it and then steered
 the course again. Lat 6.42 South Long 81.13 West

Remarks On Saturday April 14th
 P.M. Light breeze through the night afternoon
 steering S. N. W. (S. N. W. S. S. Island
 off starboard beam. Starboard watch on deck
 employed at ship's duty. at 4^h saw number of seals
 washed off. Moderate wind all night. P.M.
 daylight nearly calm. at 9^h 10^h last light
 air from S. - Point Paita bearing S. N. W.
 23 mile dist. ship headed S. W. at 11^h
 saw a ship off the beam. Number Catamarans
 in sight.
 Lat 5.20 South Long 81.23 West

Remarks On Sunday April 15th
 P.M. Having a gentle wind from S.
 steering S. for Point Paita (dist 13 miles
 at 4^h off Paita head. A whaler with six Spanish
 yards off the bow supposed to be the Constitution
 of Massachusetts at 3^h off the Head of Paita
 lowered a boat Capt. Jones whose "mole" ship
 lay on the beach. The boat came aboard at 9. P.M.
 with three men. William Sampson, "Crew" Capt. under
 the necessity of chastising him through the night ship laying
 under lee of the land. A.M. steering for the port with a light wind
 at 9^h Capt. went ashore
