 took them aboard & hoisted in.

 hoisted them washed off. Midnight. A gentle
 wind. A.M. watch on deck employed at
 hauling & mincing Blackfish blubber at
 1 hour, saw Blackfish lowered down waist
 & low boat got on, each.

Remarks On Thursday April 19th
 P.M. Having moderate trade at 1 P.M.
 lowered down again for Blackfish, then
 them about a hour & half then came
 about the watch employed on the blubber
 steering N. at 6 P.M. steering N.W. S.S.
 3 P.M. used ship heading N.W. by the wind
 veered a five in the forks commencing
 boiling. 4 P.M. port watch on deck employed
 at boiling Blackfish blubber. 10 P.M. steering
 N.W. at 12 M. found boiling.

Remarks On Friday April 20th
 P.M. Moderate trade steering N.W.
 Starboard watch on deck employed
 at ship's duty. Weather thick &
 hazy. Midnight light winds from S.E.
 P.M. S.S. Port watch on deck employed
 at ship's duty. Wind from S.E.
 at 8 P.M. saw a large school of Blackfish
 lowered 3 boats & chased them without
 success, very wild & going quick.

Remarks On Saturday April 21st
 P.M. Moderate trade at usual, steering
 S.W. Starboard watch on deck employed
 weather thick but seeing. - saw Porpoises
 & Kimbachs at 4 P.M. washed off. Midnight
 light winds. P.M. steering S.W. by N.W.
 Port watch on deck employed at ship's
 duty. at 1 P.M. got out Irish Apples. 4 ome
 & 13 coils of twine stowed down again.
 Weather clear & pleasant.
