

Remarks On Sunday April 22nd 1860
 P.M. Moderate wind & pleasant weather
 steering S.W. by W. Starboard watch on
 deck, getting down at ship's duty, - at 3^h
 put below 100 fathoms of Blackfish oil, - at
 4^h washed off & got supper. Midnight
 light winds. A.M. Starboard watch
 on deck. - Weather mild & pleasant weather
 some thick & smoky which is but seeing
 yesterday made a large mistake in working up
 the longitude.
 Lat 1.42 South Long 90.34 West

Remarks On Monday April 23rd
 P.M. Moderate winds, steering S.W. by S
 having warm weather & thick smoke
 not anything seen today without few Porpoises.
 Port watch on deck, - at 3^h huff to the wind
 heading S. by E. at 5^h steering S.W. by S
 Midnight light winds. A.M. warm &
 pleasant & smooth. Port watch on deck
 getting down at ship's duty, - got out a lot of
 beef.
 Lat 1.42 South Long 90.34 West

Remarks On Tuesday April 24th
 P.M. having light weather, warm & pleasant
 steering S.W. by S. Starboard watch on
 deck employed as usual at various duties
 at 4^h washed off. 5^h saw a sail & point
 off starboard bow, - at 6^h huff to the wind
 heading S. by W. Midnight the same
 A.M. & pleasant weather. - Starboard
 watch on deck employed. - Land astern one
 of the Gallapagos Islands. - at 11^h saw a white water
 off starboard beam it was Blackfish at 11^h
 lowered our boats for them. Lat 1.30 Long 90.52

Remarks On Wednesday April 25th
 P.M. At 1^h boat came aboard without
 success, from Blackfishing. - steered the course
 again S.W. with a fresh wind from E.
 mild weather & clear beautiful seeing
 but not anything to be seen of any consequence
 Port watch on deck employed. - at 6^h washed off
 1^h 6^h steering S.W. by W. Midnight the same
 A.M. light weather. - at 6^h steering S.W. by W.
 Port watch on deck employed at various duties.
 Lat 1.35 Long

Remarks On Thursday April 26th
 P.M. Moderate & very pleasant, steering S.W. by
 W. Starboard watch on deck employed at 3^h
 saw a sail off port beam, 3^h huff to the wind
 on port tack. 4^h washed off. Ship Com Morris
 of Palmyra Capt Jones run down & huff
 the wind off our weather beam. Capt Morris
 came aboard, ordered boat's crew & had
 a gun for the first time. Midnight - overcast
 ship. A.M. 6^h each ship heading S by W
 Starboard watch on deck employed.
 Lat 1.30 South Long 91.30 West

Remarks On Friday April 27th
 P.M. Moderate weather & warm thick &
 smoky. Ship Com Morris off weather beam
 Port watch on deck employed.
 Midnight calm & few light airs
 A.M. pleasant weather. - saw frigate
 Blackfish & finback. Port watch on deck
 employed at fixing & capping the ends
 of the fore & main rigging by attending
 to other duties.
