 12 mid. tacked ship, heading S. E.
 P.M. pleasant & clear, Starboard watch
 on deck employed at cleaning ship, at
 3^h saw a breach 1 point off weather bow
 4^h washed off the deck, midnight by the
 light all night, A.M. having a fine
 breeze from S.E. at 7^h Mr. Benson created an
 excitement from aloft by informing us
 that they were Spanish Whales off by quarters
 speered for them & found them them to
 be Grampuses "the Chirre's look."

Remarks on board Monday June 4th
 P.M. Pleasant weather with moderate
 trade steering full & by, heading S.
 on port tack, Port watch on deck, saw
 porpoises &c. at sunset took in the fore
 & mizzen top, gal, & 11^h saw a sail
 off weather beam steering to the northeast
 with the courses up & 12^h sails in.
 A.M. wore ship heading S. E. Port watch
 on deck employed at mending & running for
 the fore topgalant halcyards.

Remarks on board Tuesday June 5th
 P.M. Having moderate trade, steering
 by the wind, heading S. E. Starboard watch
 on deck, 3^h thick & squally with rain,
 4^h washed off, midnight wind & weather
 the same, A.M. 4^h squally & rainy, 7^h
 Starboard watch on deck, at 9^h tacked
 ship heading S. by E. set the fore top gal
 sail, saw 12 backs from aloft.

Lat 00.29 North Long 120.49 West

Remarks on board Wednesday June 6th
 P.M. Thick & misty weather with a
 heavy sea & fresh trade steering full
 & by, heading S. by E. Port watch on
 deck, 10 backs looking at 3^h washed off
 the deck, midnight steering full & by
 A.M. strong trade, at 6^h tacked ship
 heading S. E. 1^h Port watch on deck,
 rugged weather, ship plunging into a
 head head sea, & rain some squalls.

Lat 00.15 South Long 120.17

Remarks on board Thursday June 7th
 P.M. Having strong trade & rugged weather
 steering full & by, heading S. E. 1^h 1^h Comp
 Starboard watch on deck, at 4^h washed
 off the deck, at sunset took in the light sails.
 Midnight, tacked ship heading S. E.
 A.M. wind & weather the same, 8^h set the
 main top gal sail & flying jib, 10 has long
 dry today not anything seen, without its flying
 fish, any quantity of them, "2 good signs I suppose."

Lat 00.17 South Long 119.21 West

Remarks on board Friday June 8th
 P.M. Strong trade with at sea and a thick
 squally disagreeable weather, steering full & by
 heading S. by E. Port watch on deck, got out
 2 lbs of Yellow, at 4^h washed off the deck.
 Midnight steering, full & by, A.M. 5^h
 boarded the main tack, at 6^h wore ship
 heading S. by E. 8^h sent down the fore
 top sail, sent another in its place & reef
 it, & main & mizzen top gal also, Port
 watch on deck, repairing the fore top gal.
