

Remarks on board Saturday June 9<sup>th</sup> 1860  
P.M. Strong trades & rugged weather, steering  
full & by heading S. by E. Ship under single  
reef topsail. Starboard watch on deck sheathing  
the fore topsail with "cotton drilling" used on  
piece that was put aboard for trade. 5h. rolled  
up the sail & stowed in the sailroom till tomorrow - at  
sunset hauled up the mainsail. Midnight  
steering full & by. A.M. 5h. boarded the main  
tack. 6h. to work on the fore topsail. 7h.  
Starboard watch on deck.

Lat 00.37 North Long 116.08

Remarks on board Sunday June 10<sup>th</sup>  
P.M. Fresh trades, & an old swell &  
heaving, steering full & by, heading S. by E.  
Port watch on deck employed on the fore  
topsail, sheathing it with new cotton drilling  
fresh another piece to day that was put aboard  
for trade. At 3h. finished the topsail sent  
it up & stowed the other away. at 4h.  
washed off. Midnight by the wind. A.M.  
7h. saw a sheeted boat stowed for us at  
11h. spoke up, "Columbus," had got 90 lbs of oil  
since we parted.

Remarks on board Monday June 11<sup>th</sup>  
P.M. In company with the Bark Columbus  
steering full & by. At 8h. off the lee beam  
supplied the Pacific of S. F. At sunset  
Capt came aboard, was forward on the  
fore tack, full & by all night. A.M.  
Strong winds again this morning ship heading  
S. by E. Bark Columbus off weather bow. 5h.  
put out 2 lbs of bread & broke out for water.  
7h. Starboard watch on deck employed

Lat 01.40 North Long 116.34 West

Remarks on board Tuesday June 12<sup>th</sup>  
P.M. More ship heading S. by E. by the  
wind. Strong trades with a rigged  
sea & thick misty weather. Port watch  
on deck, at 4h. washed off the deck  
Midnight steering full & by. A.M. Moderate  
trades, at 6h. saw a sail off the quarter  
on the southern tack. 7h. Port watch on deck  
at 8h. sent down the mainsail to repair  
&c.

Lat 01.19 South Long 116.34 West

Remarks on board Wednesday June 13<sup>th</sup>  
P.M. Moderate trades & fair weather to  
light breeze, steering full & by  
by heading S. by E. Starboard watch on deck  
to work on the mainsail. at 5h. quit  
working & put it away till morning. Midnight  
full & by. A.M. pleasant & clear weather  
with a nice breeze. at 6h. to work on the  
mainsail. 7h. Starboard watch on deck to  
work on the foretopsail at 9h. finished it  
& tacked ship heading S.

Lat 01.33 North Long 116.02 West

Remarks on board Thursday June 14<sup>th</sup>  
P.M. Moderate trades, pleasant & clear, Port  
watch on deck sent up the mainsail & bent it  
employed at taking a mizzen staysail & piece  
for the canvas. at 3h. saw a sail 1 point  
off the bow on the northern tack. At 6h. Bark  
Columbus passed 1/2 a mile to the weather of  
us - at sunset took ship heading S. by E. took  
in fore top gal sail. Midnight steering full & by.  
A.M. Columbus 3 points off the bow.  
Port watch on deck employed.
