 out. A.M. Clear & pleasant, Starboard
 watch on deck at 8^h tacked ship headed
 S. by E. At 12 mid. saw a large
 vessel 1 point off weather bow 10 miles distant
 Lat 11° 13' North Long 115° 24' West

Remarks on board Saturday June 14th
 P.M. Fresh trades & a smooth sea with
 a strong current setting to the Western, saw
 nothing, more of that fresh. any quantity
 of Blackfish & chasing the ship at 4^h &
 lowered & gave them 100 shots without success
 Midnight tacked ship headed N. E.
 by the wind. A.M. Strong trades, - &
 poor seeing having a hazy atmosphere. Port
 watch on deck at 12 mid tacked ship
 heading S.
 Lat 11° 14' North Long 115° 16' West

Remarks on board Sunday June 15th
 P.M. Having strong trades & a strong
 current setting to the S.W. ship heading S.
 by the wind. Starboard watch on deck at
 4^h pump ship & passed off a sunset
 took in the light sails. Midnight
 Moderate calm A.M. Thick & cloudy
 at 8^h cleared away pleasant, Starboard
 watch on deck at 10^h set fore upper sail.
 Lat 11° 30' North Long 115° 38' West

Remarks on board Monday June 16th
 P.M. Strong trades, - ship heading
 S. by E. by the wind. Port watch on deck
 at 2^h tacked ship headed N. E. the
 current is at a stand, at 4^h had a
 squall handed the fore & main top-gal-sail
 & flying jib. At 5^h set the light sails
 Midnight steering full & by. A.M.
 thick & cloudy again, at 8^h lower
 ship headed S. by E. Port watch on deck
 attending at ship gang.
 Lat 11° 05' North Long 115° 03'

Remarks on board Tuesday June 17th
 P.M. Pleasant & clear with moderate trades
 were not seen anything to day, if any account
 in fact, we stood any day our whaler looks
 dubious this cruise. Starboard watch on deck
 at 4^h tacked ship headed N. E.
 Midnight at night, at 1^h A.M. veered
 ship headed S. by E. 6^h clear & pleasant
 with a gentle wind 7^h veered ship
 headed E. by N. Starboard watch on deck.
 The current has turned setting N. E.
 Lat 11° 14' North Long 114° 33' West

Remarks on board Wednesday June 20th
 P.M. Having gentle winds & nearly
 calm part of the time, weather is pleasant
 having an old swell from S. E. ship heading
 E. by N. by the wind. At 3^h saw a Finback
 Port watch on deck. D. Whiffy on duty
 again, at sunset veered ship headed S. by
 N. Midnight thick & heavy dew, - were
 ship headed N. E. A.M. Fair weather,
 Port watch on deck employed at ship's
 duty, at 8^h tacked ship headed S.
 Lat 11° 23' North Long 114° 26' West
