

Remarks on board Wednesday June 21st
 P.M. Moderate breeze with a thick
 misty atmosphere. Starboard watch on
 deck. Nothing seen today, at all, at 12
 washed the deck & got supper. At night
 thick & heavy dew, nearly calm and
 a light breeze towards morning. A.M.
 at 6 1/2, both ships headed S. E. by E.
 1 p. Starboard watch on deck, at 10 1/2
 passed around the fands, nearly calm.
 Lat 00.12 North Long 114.02 West

Remarks on board Thursday June 22nd
 P.M. Light breeze, ship heading S
 by the wind with clear & pleasant
 weather. Port watch on deck, got out
 meat, saw a piece of squid from aloft
 good sign. But signs all fail with us.
 Midnight had a gentle wind, steering
 full & by. A.M. Fair weather & a
 smooth sea, took the sling from the fore
 yard & shortened it. 1/2 Port watch on deck
 Lat 00.29 South Long 114.11 West

Remarks on board Saturday June 23rd
 P.M. Breeze of gentle wind from S. E.
 ship heading S. by W. by the wind.
 Starboard watch on deck, at 12, washed
 the deck, at 12 1/2 Midnight started ship
 headed S. E. by E. Caught a porpoise in
 the middle watch. A.M. fair, beam
 atmosphere light haze. Starboard
 watch on deck attending at ship's duty
 Lat 1.02 South Long 114.00 West

Remarks on board Sunday June 24th
 P.M. Breeze fresh, waves with squally
 weather, ship by the wind, heading
 S. by E. Port watch on deck, employed
 at cleaning the paint work. Mr. McKee
 stands, & watch tonight, I suppose we
 are bound to the off shore or braked ground
 Midnight strong winds, handed the main
 & fathoms. A.M. strong breeze, Port
 watch on deck, repairing main top gal sail
 we are taking in the lead, night.
 Lat 3.30 South Long 114.35 West

Remarks on board Monday June 25th
 P.M. Strong breeze ship rounded to pass
 heading S. by the wind. Starboard
 watch on deck, Bound to the braked
 ground. Midnight wind more moderate
 set the main top gal and 8 flying jib
 A.M. strong winds & puffing with a
 long heavy sea. Starboard watch on
 deck, not anything occurred worthy of note
 plenty of flying fish.
 Lat 3.39 South Long 114.16 West

Remarks on board Tuesday June 26th
 P.M. Fresh breeze, steering S. by E. &
 3/4, heading S. by a heavy swell heaving
 from S. E. Whistles impeded the ship's
 progress. Port watch on deck - at 12
 took up 6 empty casks & filled them
 with salt water & lashed them from
 the rigging for trimming the ship by
 the head. Midnight by the wind. A.M.
 Port watch on deck attending at ship's duty
 Lat 6.13 South Long 115.47 West
