 watch on deck. At 1st got out 2nd of by - at
 2nd washed off. At 3rd part the night
 squally reefed the fore-top-sail. A.M. calm
 & squally with a rugged sea, heading S. E.
 & velvet, a large school of Blackfish close
 to it being tugged almost lower. Starboard
 watch on deck turned the reef out of
 the fore & main top-sails.

Remarks on Wednesday July 4th
 P.M. Light winds & calm with a
 heavy swell. Steering by the wind heading
 S. E. at 1st, set flying jib & main top-gal
 sail. At 3rd, bent the sprayker. Midnight
 squally & baffling winds. J.M. Port watch
 on deck attending at ship's duty. Morning
 disagreeable weather squally & unsettled.
 Ship heading E. N. E.

Remarks on Thursday July 5th
 P.M. Moderate wind part of the time
 from E. N. E. from 3 to 4, nearly calm
 heading E. S. E. Starboard watch on deck,
 at 1st, washed off. Midnight baffling winds
 & calm. A.M. A gentle wind from E
 S. E. steering full & by, heading S. E. A small
 sea & clear weather. 1st Starboard watch on
 deck, not anything occurred worthy to note
 this forenoon.

Remarks on Friday July 6th 1850
 P.M. Having clear & pleasant weather
 with a gentle wind from S. E. by E. steering
 by the wind. Ship heading S. E. by E.
 Port watch on deck. J.M. off duty sick.
 Midnight light baffling winds & part
 of the time calm, with some rain.
 A.M. weather clear & pleasant. 1st
 Port watch on deck. At 5th, saw a large
 breach off weathered bow on bow from that saw
 sprouts so far off, couldn't make them out at
 11th, saw "Sulphur Bottoms" supposes the same
 that we saw before. Lat 22.41 South Long 112.11

Remarks on Saturday July 7th
 P.M. Light baffling winds from E. N. E.
 to S. E. Ship heading E. S. E. to E.
 by the wind. Starboard watch on deck
 weather clear & good seeing till 3rd, had
 a light squall then light weather again.
 Saw Sulphur Bottoms. J.M. off duty sick.
 Squally through the night with rain.
 A.M. Strong wind from S. E. by E
 & squalls, steering a course E. by N.
 by compass. Starboard on deck, at 1st
 took in fore top gal sail.

Lat 23.03 South Long 110.40 West

Remarks on Sunday July 8th
 P.M. Having a fresh wind from N.
 steering E. by N. point N. Port watch
 on deck employed at cleaning ship &c.
 J.M. sick. At sun-set squally with rain
 & baffling winds. 8th, cleared away pleasant
 with a steady wind from N. A.M.
 clear & a nice wind - good seeing.
 Port watch on deck. At 1st, saw a breach
 off weathered beam, prove to be Sulphur
 bottoms.
